- 1. Corrupt government officials 79.6%
- 2. People I love dying (#5 in 2019) 58.5%
- 3. A loved one contracting the coronavirus (COVID-19) 58%
- 4. People I love becoming seriously ill (#3 in 2019) 57.3%
- 5. Widespread civil unrest 56.5%
