GETTING TO KNOW YOU

- Icebreaker Question | In advertising, word-of-mouth marketing is considered to be the most effective form of reaching potential consumers. What is a recent thing – say a restaurant, book, movie, vacation, local contractor, etc. – you shared a glowing review about with a family member or friend?
- 2. This is the second week of the Spring Quarter for Community Groups. Use the following questions to "set the stage" for your time together this Spring.
 - a) What are you looking forward to about being in a group this Spring? If this is your first experience with a small group at Rivers Crossing, what led you to join?
 - b) If your group is new, or you're welcoming new members, getting to know each other's personal story is a fantastic place to start building community. While there are many ways you can do this, here's a simple structure you can use: The "2x4" Story – Spend two minutes talking about each of these four aspects of your life: family of origin, current family, spiritual journey, and desired future.
- 3. When you hear the word evangelism (i.e., sharing the message of Jesus), what first thoughts come to mind and what emotions do you feel? Explain your answers.

DIVING DEEPER

- 4. In his book *8 to 15: The World Is Smaller Than You Think*, Pastor Tom Mercer writes, "Nobody would ever say Christianity is easy, but [the message of Christianity] has always been simple." How would you explain the good news of Jesus to someone who asked you? How would you connect this good news with your own story of coming to faith? In your explanations, strive for clarity and simplicity.
- 5. During his sermon, Pastor Josh shared several reasons why we don't share our faith. If you're hesitant or perhaps even lack the desire to share your faith, can you relate with any of the reasons listed below¹? If you're willing, explain your answer. *1. List adapted from Pastor Josh and Steven Lee's "Four Reasons We Don't Share the Gospel"*
 - Not Being a Follower of Jesus | though you believe in Jesus, you're not willing to heed His command to go and make disciples (Matthew 28:18-20)
 - Lack of Gospel Knowledge | struggle with articulating the truths of the gospel
 - Apathy | lack of prioritization to interact, engage with, or even pray for those who don't know Jesus Christ
 - Fear | paralyzed by the thought of being disliked, marginalized, laughed at, or openly mocked
 - Lack of Compassion | lack of care for those who are without hope
 - a) How might you begin working to address/overcome these reasons?
 - b) How can your Christian community inspire you to continue sharing your faith?

6. Describe the last time you shared your faith with another person. What led to that moment and how did you feel during and after it?

Read Colossians 4:2-6 and 1 Corinthians 9:19-23 together. Pastor Josh provided three ways for how we can share our faith: 1) we meet their need, 2) we take a risk, and 3) we sacrifice ourselves and eliminate distractions so we can be available for others.

Colossians 4:2-6 (NIV) – ²Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. ³And pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. ⁴Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should. ⁵Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. ⁶Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone.

1 Corinthians 9:19-23 (HCSB) – ¹⁹Although I am a free man and not anyone's slave, I have made myself a slave to everyone, in order to win more people. ²⁰To the Jews I became like a Jew, to win Jews; to those under the law, like one under the law—though I myself am not under the law—to win those under the law. ²¹To those who are without that law, like one without the law—not being without God's law but within Christ's law—to win those without the law. ²²To the weak I became weak, in order to win the weak. I have become all things to all people, so that I may by every possible means save some. ²³Now I do all this because of the gospel, so I may become a partner in its benefits.

Which of these three ways can you better step into as you live out the commission Jesus gave to all Christians to share their faith?

TAKING IT HOME

7. Group Prayer Exercise | Sharing Your Faith With Your 8 to 15

As you conclude your group, pray over a few names from each person's 8 to 15 list. Ask the Holy Spirit to provide discernment on how to best engage and nurture these relationships. Ask for opportunities to invite to church, especially as we approach Easter. Ask for opportunities to share the love of Jesus Christ and to humbly serve those around you. Ask for boldness in sharing the good news. And finally, ask for the fear of evangelism to be replaced by the joy of seeing lives changed.

Philemon 4-6 (ESV) – ⁴I thank my God always when I remember you in my prayers, ⁵because I hear of your love and of the faith that you have toward the Lord Jesus and for all the saints, ⁶and I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective for the full knowledge of every good thing that is in us for the sake of Christ.

- ENCOURAGE: One of the primary roles your group will play is in encouraging one another forward in your individual walks with Christ. This includes supporting one another through the messiness and trials of life.

- EQUIP: Regularly encountering God's Word through the sermon, group discussion, and personal study will, over time, equip each group member to be a more fully engaged follower of Jesus. As this information permeates the heart, the Holy Spirit will provide application and personal growth.
 2 Timothy 3:16-17; John 14:25-26
- EMPOWER: As your group meets, you will see some people naturally begin to exhibit spiritual gifts including leadership, shepherding, and hospitality. Be on the lookout for these developments. Empower these individuals to step into larger roles within the group, to consider leading or hosting their own group, or to serve where led. | *Ephesians 4:11-16; Philippians 3:10-14*
- EXPAND: As each member of your group begins to invest in their "8 to 15," it's natural for your group to add new members and to connect others into groups ministry. | *John 13:34-35*
