Community Group Discussion Guide October 22, 2023 Foundations of Faith Week #3 / Pastor Paul Taylor The Word Can Change Your Life

GETTING TO KNOW YOU

- 1. Icebreaker Question | If you were going on a spiritual retreat, what three things (other than your Bible) would you take and why?
- 2. This week's passage from James (James 1:18-27) focuses on our engagement with the "word of truth" (vs. 18) the Bible.
 - a) How would you summarize your beliefs about the Bible? Do you see it as God's inspired and authoritative word or something else? Explain your answer.
 - b) What does your level of engagement with the Bible look like? How often do you read the Bible? If you read it, do you follow a plan, journal, meditate, memorize verses, study with aids like a Bible dictionary or commentary, et cetera?
- 3. Read James 1:18 together. In what way(s) was God's word connected with your decision to first believe in Jesus Christ? Was there a particular verse or passage that God used to awaken your faith?
 - James 1:18 (NIV) He chose to give us birth through the word of truth, that we might be a kind of firstfruits of all he created.

DIVING DEEPER

- 4. Read James 1:18-27 together and discuss the corresponding questions.
 - James 1:18-27 (NIV) ¹⁸He chose to give us birth through the word of truth, that we might be a kind of firstfruits of all he created. ¹⁹My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, ²⁰because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires. ²¹Therefore, get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the word planted in you, which can save you. ²²Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. ²³Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror ²⁴and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. ²⁵But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do. ²⁶Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless. ²⁷Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.
 - a) We all have a choice often a daily choice as to whether we're going to allow God's word to be the anchor of our soul/driving force of our life or the world.

 Where in your life have you done well at holding fast to and obeying God's word? Where do you sense you're still "gripped" by what the world offers? Explain.

- b) Pastor Paul shared that we have to humble ourselves when God's word confronts us. Can you think of a scenario(s) where the Bible confronted your beliefs and/or behaviors? If so, how did you respond and what was the result? c) Is there a particular teaching(s) in the Bible that you're currently being confronted with but unwilling to submit to? If you're willing, share about that. 5. James powerfully articulates that for God's word to truly transform us, we have to actually do what it says, not merely understand what it says. His words might remind you of those spoken by his brother Jesus... Matthew 7:24-29 (NIV) - 24"Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. ²⁵The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock. ²⁶But everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man who built his house on sand. ²⁷The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell with a great crash." ²⁸When Jesus had finished saying these things, the crowds were amazed at his teaching, ²⁹because he taught as one who had authority, and not as their teachers of the law. a) Can you relate to knowing God's word but not living it out? If so, explain. Did you connect at all with the analogy Pastor Paul shared of using God's word as binoculars to judge others and lift ourselves up? b) Is there an area of your life where, in earnestly committing to obey God's word, you've experienced blessing from God (James 1:25)? If so, explain. **TAKING IT HOME** 6. What's your biggest takeaway from this week's sermon and our group discussion? How can you put that into action this week?
 - Read Psalm 119:1-24 together before reflecting in silence for a few minutes. After that personal time of reflection, discuss the following questions and spend time in prayer. What do you sense God speaking to you through these verses?

7. Reflection and Group Prayer | Psalm 119:1-24

How can your group pray for you regarding either knowing and submitting yourself to God's word or something else?

Psalm 119:1-14 (NIV) – ¹Blessed are those whose ways are blameless, who walk according to the law of the Lord. ²Blessed are those who keep his statutes and seek him with all their heart—³they do no wrong but follow his ways. ⁴You have laid down precepts that are to be fully obeyed. ⁵Oh, that my ways were steadfast in obeying your decrees! ⁶Then I would not be put to shame when I consider all your commands. ⊓ will praise you with an upright heart as I learn your righteous laws. ⁸I will obey your decrees; do not utterly forsake me.

⁹How can a young person stay on the path of purity? By living according to your word. ¹⁰I seek you with all my heart; do not let me stray from your commands. ¹¹I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you. ¹²Praise be to you, Lord; teach me your decrees. ¹³With my lips I recount all the laws that come from your mouth. ¹⁴I rejoice in following your statutes as one rejoices in great riches. ¹⁵I meditate on your precepts and consider your ways. ¹⁶I delight in your decrees; I will not neglect your word.

¹⁷Be good to your servant while I live, that I may obey your word. ¹⁸Open my eyes that I may see wonderful things in your law. ¹⁹I am a stranger on earth; do not hide your commands from me. ²⁰My soul is consumed with longing for your laws at all times. ²¹You rebuke the arrogant, who are accursed, those who stray from your commands. ²²Remove from me their scorn and contempt, for I keep your statutes. ²³Though rulers sit together and slander me, your servant will meditate on your decrees. ²⁴Your statutes are my delight; they are my counselors.
