## **GETTING TO KNOW YOU**

- GROUPS
- 1. Icebreaker Questions | Playing off the name of our series Trail Markers Pastor Paul has told several stories of his outdoor hiking adventures. Share your favorite or most adventurous outdoor hiking story with your group. Is hiking an activity you currently enjoy and work into your schedule?
- 2. Pastor Paul shared that our peace is often robbed by our expectations. Specifically, our expectation that following Jesus will lead to less trouble and not more trouble. Is this an expectation you've wrestled with? If so, explain. In what ways have you delt with more trouble since following Jesus?

John 16:33 (NIV) – "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

# **DIVING DEEPER**

3. Read John 14:25-27 together. In your own words, explain how the peace of Jesus Christ is different from the peace the world gives. How might you share about this difference when comforting a non-Christian friend or family member who is experiencing a storm that has eroded their peace?

John 14:25-27 (NIV) – <sup>25</sup>"All this I have spoken while still with you. <sup>26</sup>But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you. <sup>27</sup>Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

4. Pastor Paul taught that when we're experiencing a storm that robs us of peace, we should consider whether it's a correcting storm or a perfecting storm. In other words, is it a storm of our own making that calls for turning back to God, or a storm God is allowing to happen to make us more like Jesus (Romans 8:28-29)? Read Hebrews 12:1-14 together and discuss the corresponding questions.

**Hebrews 12:1-14 (NLT)** – <sup>1</sup>Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, <sup>2</sup>fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. <sup>3</sup>Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart. <sup>4</sup>In your struggle against sin, you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. <sup>5</sup>And have you completely forgotten this word of encouragement that addresses you as a father addresses his son? It says, "My son, do not make light of the Lord's discipline, and do not lose heart when he rebukes you, <sup>6</sup>because the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and he chastens everyone he accepts as his son."

<sup>7</sup>Endure hardship as discipline; God is treating you as his children. For what children are not disciplined by their father? <sup>8</sup>If you are not disciplined—and everyone undergoes discipline—then you are not legitimate, not true sons and daughters at all. <sup>9</sup>Moreover, we have all had human fathers who disciplined us and we respected them for it. How much more should we submit to the Father of spirits and live! <sup>10</sup>They disciplined us for a little while as they thought best; but God disciplines us for our good, in order that we may share in his holiness. <sup>11</sup>No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who have been trained by it.

<sup>12</sup>Therefore, strengthen your feeble arms and weak knees.<sup>13</sup>"Make level paths for your feet," so that the lame may not be disabled, but rather healed. <sup>14</sup>Make every effort to live in peace with everyone and to be holy; without holiness no one will see the Lord.

- a) Where in this text do you see the call to repentance when facing a correcting storm?
- b) What does the writer of Hebrews give as the foundation for endurance during a perfecting storm?
- c) If you're currently experiencing a correcting or perfecting storm, take a few moments (*yes, even in the middle of group!*) to reflect on your situation. What next step might God be asking you to take?

### TAKING IT HOME

5. Though peace with God is an internal reality, it should also cause us to move toward others in the hope of achieving reconciliation and pointing them to God. Is there someone God is asking you to make peace with? If so, share about that situation and what your first step toward peace could be.

Romans 12:18 (NIV) – If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone.

6. Prayer Prompt | Read Philippians 4:4-7 and Psalm 29:11. Put these verses into action as you conclude your time together. First, if anyone in the group is experiencing anxiety (i.e., a lack of peace) about a situation, provide them a safe environment to share. Next, in a posture of rejoicing and thankfulness, go to God in prayer about this situation. Pray for the Lord to supply strength and peace in this person's life.

**Philippians 4:4-7 (NIV)** – <sup>4</sup>Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! <sup>5</sup>Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. <sup>6</sup>Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. <sup>7</sup>And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Psalm 29:11 (NIV) – The Lord gives strength to his people; the Lord blesses his people with peace.
