The Exodus Way

Intro: The book of Exodus is not just a story about escape from Egypt, but a journey that shapes God's people—out of slavery, through the wilderness, and into covenant life with Him. Exodus begins by reminding us that God's story didn't start here; it's the continuation of God's faithful promises, even when circumstances turn dark and confusing. Through figures like the Hebrew midwives, we see that God often brings salvation through unexpected people who fear Him and choose faithfulness over fear. Ultimately, Exodus is our story too, forming our identity as a rescued people who now live and act differently in the world because of what God has done for us.

Story: Share a way that God has met you that defines how you now live your life.

Read: Exodus 1

1. If Exodus is “our story,” what parts of Israel's experience do you most resonate with right now—waiting, suffering, growth, or rescue?
2. How does understanding Israel's history as an oppressed people shape the way we treat others today?
3. The Hebrew midwives feared God more than Pharaoh. What might fearing God look like in everyday decisions we make today?
4. Read Hebrews 11. Why do you think the author of Hebrews wants us to see that these stories are our story?
5. Like the midwives, what's a risk you can take to partner with God in his redemption for the whole world?
