Discussion Questions 2/1/26

Moses - Saved, Summoned, Sent

Intro: Moses' story shows us a God who saves, summons, and sends imperfect people into His purposes. From a baby rescued through subversive obedience, to a man shaped by justice and failure, to a reluctant leader called by a holy God, Moses' life reminds us that God is close to the hurting and active in history. The same God who saw and heard Israel still sees and hears today. Following Him means encountering His presence and being sent to love others.

Story: How have you seen God gift you and shape the things you care about? (If this is difficult to answer the group may also affirm how they see the person gifted.)

Read: Exodus 3

1. Are you more likely to doubt God's ability to work through you—or to doubt your own worthiness? How does Moses' story speak to that?
2. Moses grows up caught between two identities—Hebrew and Egyptian. Where do you see tension or complexity in your own identity or story?
3. Moses' passion for justice existed before his calling. What parts of your personality or life experience might God want to redirect rather than remove?
4. Read Hebrews 3. How is Jesus greater than Moses?
5. Moses offered many excuses when God sent him. What is God sending you to and what excuses are you tempted to give him?
