In week two we turned attention to 2 Corinthians 5:12-15.


We learned that the ambassador's life, ministry, and message must touch the heart and not be superficial.

2 Corinthians 6:1 says: "*We then, [as] workers together [with Him]* also plead with [you] not to receive the grace of God in vain."

As an ambassador, you dare not do or say that which is different to which you were sent. If you do, you will be recalled.

We don't work for God, we work *with* God; we are partners with God, in Christ, via the Holy Spirit.


Working with God

If we are truly ambassadors for Christ representing His kingdom, it is because we are working for God and working together with God.

"We don't just work for God, but we work together with God." – Pastor Kola Taiwo, New Wine Church Woolwich. We are working for God as partners with God, in Christ, via the Holy Spirit (read 1 Corinthians 3:9).

Also read: 1 Corinthians 3:9, Mark 16:20, Hebrews 3:1, Hebrews 3:14, Hebrews 6:4, Hebrews 12:8.

Other scriptures to back up our co-labouring:



The term 'follower' is a term of accountability. We work together with God for God's interests.

We are often taught that we have the Holy Spirit, but we are not really taught how to let the Holy Spirit take control.

The reason is because Christians are not taught to live by their regenerated human spirit, but rather to suppress their souls. This is an impossible feat!

However, the Bible teaches that when you yoke yourself to Christ and live the crucified life, the soul is restricted, and your regenerated human spirit is now in control.

A man or woman who is living the crucified life and the regenerated human spirit is in control, can say **2 Corinthians 5:16:**

"Therefore, from now on, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we have known Christ according to the flesh, yet now we know [Him thus] no longer."

"To not regard or know man or Christ according to the flesh is to now know man and Christ according to the Spirit in our human spirit!" – *Pastor Kola Taiwo, New Wine Church Woolwich*.

This is what pleases God whom we:

- 1. Work for!
- 2. Work with!
- 3. Allow to crucify **self** as "God in Christ as the Holy Spirit" regulates our **human spirit** within us.

Why, you might ask?

Because of **1 Corinthians 1:29**: *"That no flesh should glory in His presence."*
