Famous Last Words [Jesus Died So You Can Have Life] Discussion Guide

Summary

This sermon focuses on Jesus' final words on the cross 'It is finished' (tetelestai in Greek, nishlam in Hebrew).
Jonathan explains that these words carry deep meaning
beyond just completion, signifying that our debt has been
paid in full, justice has been satisfied, and reconciliation
with God is now possible.

The sermon also addresses Jesus' emotional struggle in Gethsemane and His choice to obey God's will despite His human feelings, teaching us about surrender and obedience.

- How does understanding Jesus' emotional struggle in Gethsemane help you in your own spiritual journey?
- What are some ways you can tell if Jesus is truly Lord of your life?
- Why do you think Jesus chose to remind Himself of Psalm 22 while on the cross?
- How does knowing that God never turns His back on us impact your relationship with Him?
- What areas of your life do you need to surrender more fully to Christ?

Life Application

This week, identify one area of your life where you've been following your own way rather than God's way. Make a conscious decision each morning to surrender that area to God and follow His leading, even when it's difficult.
