

Covenant [A Promise Of Purpose] Discussion Guide

Summary

This sermon focuses on God's covenant with Moses and the Israelites, particularly through the Ten Commandments. The pastor explains how God's laws weren't meant to be burdensome rules, but rather guidelines for living a life in relationship with Him and being set apart as His people. The message emphasizes that while no one can perfectly follow all the laws, Jesus fulfilled them on our behalf through His death and resurrection, establishing a new covenant based on grace.

- How can we balance being 'in the world but not of it' in our daily lives?
- What practical steps can we take to love God with all our heart, soul, and mind?

Life Application

This week, identify one area where you've been trying to blend in with the world rather than standing out as a follower of Christ. Make a conscious effort to live differently in that area, remembering that you are called to be set apart for God's purposes.
