

Famous Last Words [Jesus Loved His Enemies] Discussion Guide

Summary

This sermon begins a series on Jesus's last words on the cross, focusing on His statement 'Father, forgive them, for they don't know what they are doing.' The message explores how Jesus demonstrated the ultimate example of loving one's enemies by praying for those who were crucifying Him. The sermon emphasizes that as Christians, we are called to follow Jesus's example by forgiving others and showing love to those who mistreat us, even though it goes against worldly wisdom.

- What practical steps can we take to begin forgiving someone who has hurt us?
- How does understanding God's forgiveness of our sins help us forgive others?
- What does it mean to 'go the extra mile' for someone who has wronged you?
- How can we pray for those who mistreat us when we don't feel like it?

Life Application

This week, identify one person who has hurt or offended you. Commit to praying for them daily and look for one practical way to show them kindness, regardless of how they respond.
