The Flame That Forms Us [Bold Faith Is Sacrificial] Discussion Guide

Summary

This sermon explores the concept of bold faith and sacrifice through the story of Stephen in Acts 7 and other biblical examples. Jonathan emphasizes that true sacrifice comes from keeping our focus on Jesus, not from the act of sacrifice itself. He contrasts two perspectives: asking how much we must give up to follow Jesus versus choosing to follow Jesus regardless of the cost, illustrated through the story of Mary anointing Jesus' feet and Judas's betrayal.

- What's the difference between sacrificing out of obligation versus love for Jesus?
- How does Mary's act of anointing Jesus' feet challenge our view of sacrifice?
- What are some practical ways we can keep our focus on Jesus in daily life?
- How can we distinguish between worldly sacrifice and godly sacrifice?

Life Application

This week, identify one area where you've been hesitant to follow God fully. Commit to keeping your focus on Jesus rather than the potential cost, and take one specific step of obedience in that area.
