

What Was I Made For? [Relationship] Discussion Guide

Summary

This sermon explores the fundamental purpose of human existence - to know God personally and intimately, not just to know about Him intellectually. Jonathan emphasizes the difference between having head knowledge about God versus having a deep, personal relationship with Him. Using various scripture passages, particularly Hosea 6:3 and John 17:3, the message explains how humans were created for relationship with God and how this relationship can be developed through engaging with Scripture and prayer.

Intro Prayer

Lord, as we gather to discuss Your Word, open our hearts and minds to understand more deeply what it means to truly know You. Help us move beyond surface-level knowledge to experience genuine relationship with You. Guide our discussion and reveal Your truth to each person here. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Ice Breaker

Have you ever had an experience where you thought you knew a lot about something, but later realized how little you actually knew? What was that experience like?

Questions

- What's the difference between knowing **about** God and **knowing** God personally?
- How would you describe your current relationship with God - is it more head knowledge or heart knowledge?
- What are some practical ways we can pursue a deeper relationship with God?
- How does regular prayer and Bible reading contribute to knowing God more intimately?
- Why do you think many people settle for knowing about God rather than pursuing a relationship with Him?
- How can we ensure our Bible reading doesn't become just an intellectual exercise?
- What role does vulnerability play in developing a deeper relationship with God?
- How might your life look different if you pursued knowing God more intentionally?

Life Application

This week, commit to spending intentional time each day in both Bible reading and prayer. Rather than rushing through either activity, approach them as opportunities to develop a deeper relationship with God. Keep a journal of what you learn about God's character and how He speaks to you during these times.
