# Step By Step [Taking Steps To Freedom] Discussion Guide

## **Summary**

In this sermon, Jonathan continues the series on taking steps of faith by examining Moses' story from Hebrews 11:27-29. The message explores how the Israelites' journey from Egyptian slavery to freedom serves as a powerful model for our own spiritual journey. Jonathan draws parallels between endurance sports and faith, emphasizing that both require perseverance when things get difficult. The sermon traces the historical context from God's promise to Abraham through to Moses leading the Israelites out of Egypt and through the Red Sea.

#### **Intro Prayer**

Heavenly Father, as we gather to discuss the powerful example of Moses and the Israelites, open our hearts to understand what it means to step out in faith. #### **Ice Breaker**

What's something you started but wanted to quit when it became difficult? What made you push through or what made you decide to stop?

## **Questions**

- The Israelites were caught between Egypt (bondage) and the Promised Land (freedom). Where do you feel caught between bondage and freedom in your life right now?
- What is your 'Egypt' the place of bondage that God might be calling you to leave behind?
- How does keeping your eyes on 'the one who is invisible' (God) help you face your fears, like Moses did with Pharaoh?
- The Israelites had to apply the blood to their doorposts as an act of faith. How does this relate to how we apply Christ's sacrifice to our lives today?
- God didn't remove the Red Sea; He made a way through it. How has God made a way through seemingly impossible situations in your life?
- The sermon outlined three steps to freedom: leave Egypt, apply the blood, and cross the sea. Which of these steps is most challenging for you right now and why?
- Jonathan said, 'When God calls you out of bondage, don't wait, leave it behind.' What's holding you back from fully stepping into the freedom God offers?

## **Life Application**

This week, identify one area of bondage in your life that God is calling you to leave behind. It might be a harmful habit, a negative thought pattern, an unhealthy relationship, or something else that's keeping you from experiencing the freedom God intends for you. Write it down, pray about it daily, and take one concrete step toward freedom. Remember that God doesn't just deliver us FROM something; He delivers us INTO something greater. Share with at least one trusted person what step you're taking, and ask them to pray for you and hold you accountable.
