# Famous Last Words [Jesus Can Still Save You] Discussion Guide

## **Summary**

The sermon focuses on Jesus' interaction with the thief on the cross and emphasizes that it's never too late to turn to Christ for salvation. Through examining Ephesians 2, Ezekiel 37, and Luke 23, Jonathan illustrates how God can bring spiritual life to those who feel spiritually dead or too far gone. The message emphasizes that salvation is by grace through faith, not by works, and that true faith involves not just believing in Jesus but surrendering to His Lordship.

- Why do you think some people feel they are 'too far gone' for God's forgiveness?
- How does the vision of dry bones in Ezekiel relate to spiritual transformation?
- What does it mean to confess Jesus as Lord with both our mouths and our hearts?
