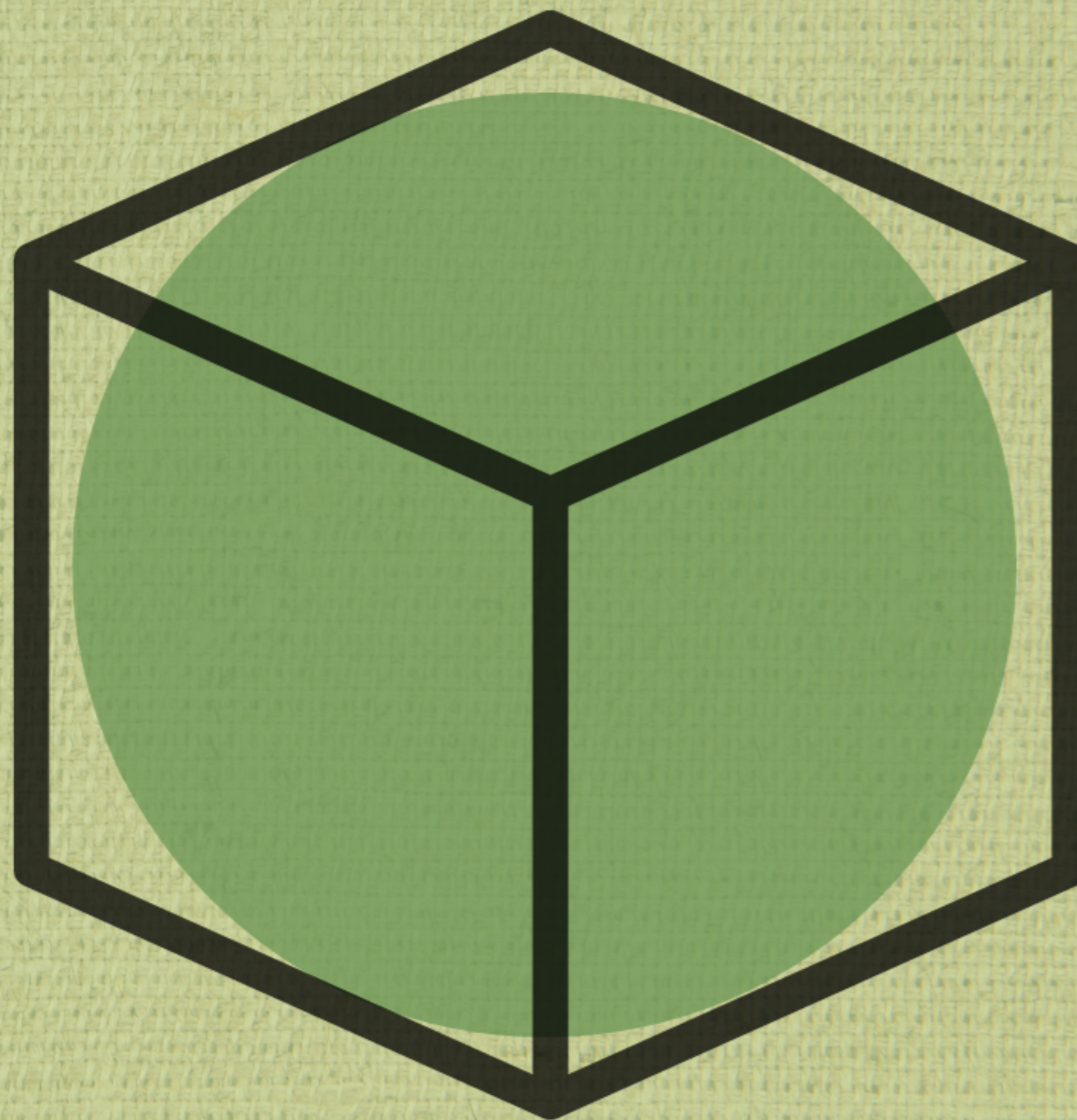

RESOLUTE

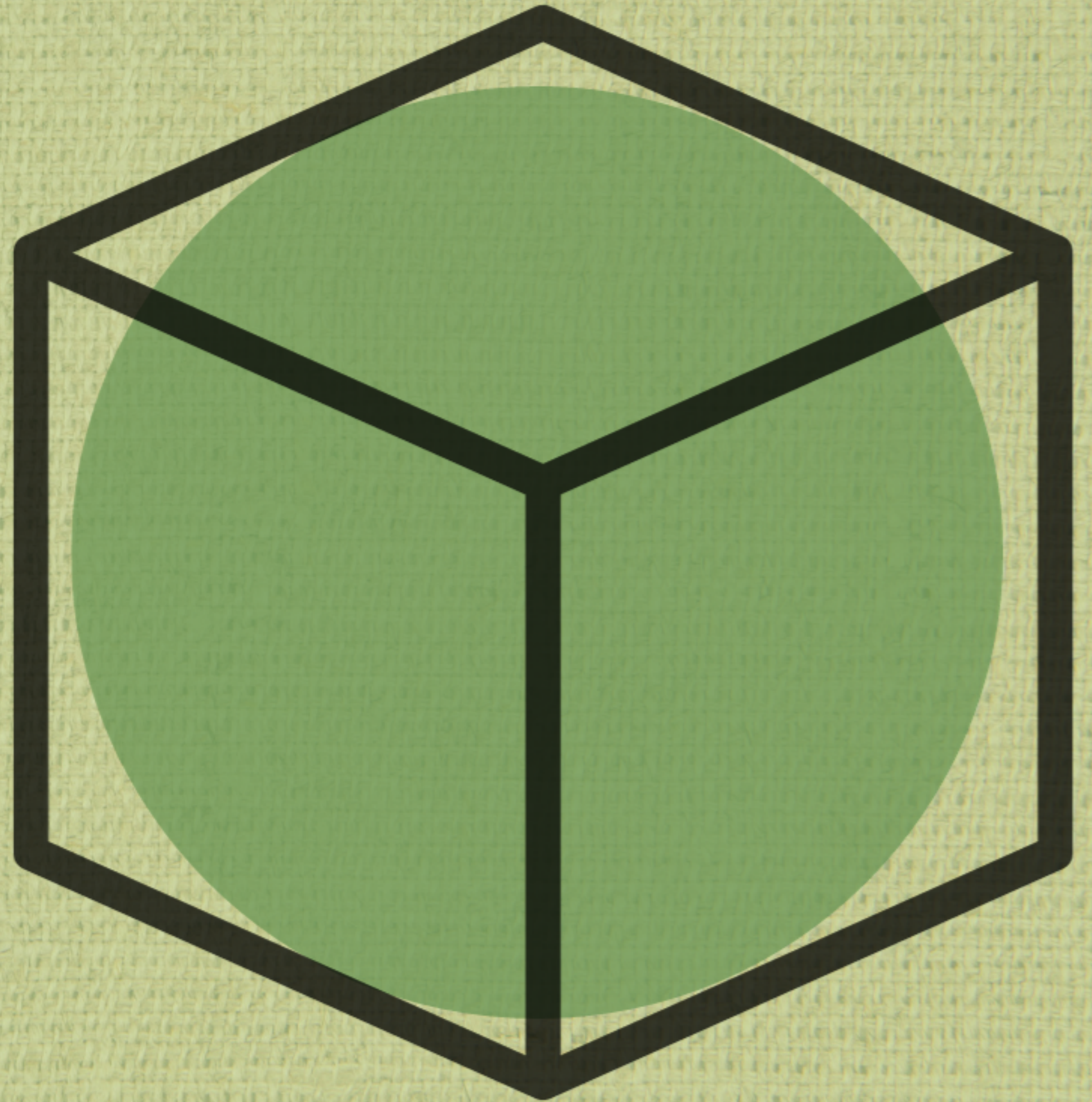
admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering
