1. What challenged you from the message?

4. Eph. 1:18-19

- a. What is supernatural power?
 - i. Is it working within our ability, or outside of us? Is it what we do or what He does?

5. Eph. 1:19-21

- a. Is the same power that raised Jesus from the dead, ascended him, and seated him at the right hand of the Father available to us right now? How do we access it?
- b. Where is the location of this power? Why is that important?

6. Eph. 1:3

- a. Why do we search for this power/blessing in human or natural places/abilities? Where should we search for it?
 - b. What is an override word? How are the words Resurrection / Ascension / Dominion override words? What do they override?
 - i. I. Can his power override our situations and circumstances?
 - ii. Does it start with believing? What would happen if we really started believing that what God says is true?
 - iii. How do we get override power operating in our lives?
7. Do we have our own philosophies? What is yours? How do these philosophies limit us?
 - a. What is God's philosophy of the world and life?
 - b. What happens when you begin to see through God's philosophy?

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8. Eph. 1:9-11

- a. How is God's philosophy the summing up or gathering all things through Christ? Why is this important?

9. Eph. 1:22-23

- a. How does our understanding of how we are connected to Him change our view of situations?

10. Eph. 2:4-6

- a. Paul wants us to know the hope and the power that is in believing it (what we pray for) has already happened.
- b. How do hope and inheritance relate to the authority we are given in Christ?
- c. Why do we need to pray and communicate with God so that we can open our understanding?
- d. What is the importance of the Zoom conferencing illustration?

11. Who will Go?

a. 1 Kings 22:19 – 22

- i. This is the story of how God is going to deal with the King of Israel, asking who will go down and take care of this Ahab situation.
- b. Who will go and do what God wants done on Earth?
- c. Does God need our ideas or opinions, or does he need someone who will go and do His will?
- d. Do we tend to hear the will of God and then start talking about what we think?
