  - a. How does this relate to maturity?
6. Rom. 8:29
  - a. Comment on “we became a new creation by His Death; we become a new formation by His life.”
  - b. Can we live a “Christian Life” or is it Christ who lives through us?
  - c. If Christ currently lives in us, how are we going to get something we already have?
7. Is. 43:1
  - a. Are Jacob and Israel the same person?
  - b. Which is created and which is formed?
  - c. How is this a redemption scripture? What is the importance of it being pre-Calvary?
  - d. Why did Israel continue to call himself Jacob?
  - e. Which is more important, what you call yourself or what God calls you?

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8. Eph. 2:10; II Cor. 5:17
  - a. We are new creations in Christ. Jacob was a new creation, but was he missing a formation?
  - b. Do we sometimes miss our opportunities for formation?
  - c. When God establishes his covenant, he references Jacob, not Israel. Why? Why is this important?
  - d. Does it show how God identifies with us?
9. Gen. 1:1 – 2
  - a. How is it that the Earth was without form? How did it need formation?
  - b. What is the importance of the Spirit of God hovering over the face of the waters?
  - c. How does this relate to identity – to a mirror?
  - d. Where do we get our identity, God or the Earth?
  - e. Can we decide what mirror we will look into, whether we see Jacob or Israel?
10. Eph. 5:26; James 1:23 – 25
  - a. What is the impact of being a hearer, but not a doer?
  - b. What image is in the mirror if you are only a hearer and not also a doer?
  - c. How does this relate to identity?
  - d. Can we walk it out alone? Do we need to? Why not?
  - e. Do we already measure up? What does that mean?
