**Deep Dive – *Queen of Sheba***

1. What has come to mind or changed for you over the last week concerning what you learned about being Prophet, Priest, and King like Jesus Christ?
2. Jim opened by reminding us that like David, we are called to “fulfill the purpose of God in our generation” (Acts 13:36). He also emphasized that God assigns each of us spheres of influence—personal, family, church, and more.
  - What sphere of influence feels most active in your life right now?
  - How does your relationship with Jesus shape your productivity and purpose?
  - Jim said productivity flows from relationship. Where do you see that in your own life?
3. The Queen of Sheba arrived with riddles to test Solomon, but left saying, “there was no more spirit in her” and that the reports she heard didn’t even tell the half of his wisdom (2 Chronicles 9:4–6).
  - What stands out to you about her transformation—from skeptic to worshiper?
  - Why do you think seeing Solomon’s wisdom, order, and excellence moved her so deeply?
  - What does this teach us about the impact of a life aligned with God?
4. Jim highlighted three elements from verse 4 that left the Queen in awe: The service of the waiters and cupbearers, their apparel, the entryway Solomon used to go up to the house of the Lord
  - Which of these three speaks to you most, and why?
  - How do these reflect Solomon’s relationship with God and his leadership?
5. Jim connected Solomon’s servants to Exodus 21:5–6—bondservants who chose lifelong service out of love, not coercion. Their service was their freedom.
  - How does serving God out of love—not obligation—change your posture?
  - Colossians 3:23–24 says to work “as unto the Lord.” What does that look like in your daily life?

- Jim said, “We serve to the level of priority.” What does that reveal about your current priorities?

6. The servants wore linen—clothing associated with royalty, not common people. Their appearance reflected the king’s care and identity.

- What does it mean for believers to “wear” the identity of Christ?
- 2 Corinthians 3:18 says we are being transformed into His image. Where do you see that happening in you?
- How does knowing you reflect the King change the way you carry yourself?

7. Solomon’s entryway symbolized his acknowledgment that his wisdom came from God. The Queen recognized this and blessed the Lord because of it (2 Chronicles 9:8).

- Why is it important to openly acknowledge God as the source of our strength and wisdom?
- Jim said God often brings us beyond our capability so we depend on Him. Where have you experienced this?
- How does 2 Corinthians 4:7 (“treasure in earthen vessels”) shape your understanding of weakness and dependence?

8. What is one specific way you will reflect the King this week—through your service, your attitude, your identity, or your dependence on God?
