What Is A HotSpot Host?

A good question we are often asked, "What is a HostSpot Host?" A HotSpot Host is a person or couple who leads the HotSpot. A Cross Waves Host is another name for a disciple-maker. We define a HotSpot Host as "an intentional Christian guide in a family setting."

The HotSpot Host is the catalyst in the disciple-making process at Cross Waves. The HotSpot Host becomes a model for others to follow. As the apostle Paul said in First Corinthians 11:1 (NLT), "And you should imitate me, just as I imitate Christ." By no means does this mean that you are perfect, but it does mean that you are passionate in your pursuit to follow Jesus and have stepped up to the plate to be a disciple-maker. A HotSpot Host is transparent and authentic. Another way to put it is, just be you, with all your flaws and imperfections. People are not asking for you to be perfect, just real. Allow others to follow you until they see Jesus.

Many who have partnered with Cross Waves came to this us with statements like "I don't know enough to be a disciple-maker." Or, "No one will listen to me." Because of this, their view of discipleship meant inviting people to their church and letting someone else take the lead in discipling their friends and family. However, their thoughts on discipleship changed when they discovered Cross Waves.

At Cross Waves, we partner with you and provide weekly Bible teaching and resources for you; but you become the lead disciplemaker and guide your family and friends until they begin to disciple their friends and family. That is what our HotSpot Hosts do; they walk alongside believers until those believers host a HotSpot themselves.

As you will see in our training videos, we use a simple process, based on the words of Jesus, to make disciples; a process to guide people to be intentional in following Christ. Based on the Great Commandment and Great Commission, in your HotSpot you will model intentionality in following Christ in three different areas: loving God, loving other people, and sharing your faith.
