WHAT'S SO BAD ABOUT THE SAMARITANS?

2 KINGS 17:6-7, 24, 33 NIV

(In 722BC)...the king of Assyria captured Samaria and deported the Israelites to Assyria...⁷ All this took place because the Israelites had sinned against the Lord their God...²⁴ The king of Assyria brought people from Babylon, Kuthah, Avva, Hamath and Sepharvaim and settled them in the towns of Samaria to replace the Israelites. They took over Samaria and lived in its towns...³³ They worshiped the Lord, but they also served their own gods in accordance with the customs of the nations from which they had been brought...

After King David, who had killed Goliath and later succeeded King Saul, his son Solomon reigned on the throne of Israel. Though Solomon began his reign with devotion, his heart turned away in his later years. He took many wives from neighboring lands and allowed them to continue serving their demonic gods. As a result of his divided heart, God divided Solomon's kingdom but waited to do so after his son, Rehoboam took the throne.

The split to the south was led by Rehoboam and called Judah (named after David's tribe and including his family). **Included in this Southern Kingdom were the tribes of Judah and Benjamin, with some Levites** also aligning with Judah.

The split to the north was led by Jeroboam, a man appointed by God through the prophet Ahijah to lead the northern tribes. However, Jeroboam quickly led Israel into idolatry by establishing false worship centers in Bethel and Dan. **This Northern Kingdom was called 'Israel' and included the 10 other tribes of the nation.** Both the Southern and Northern Kingdoms were idolatrous and fell into the hands of their enemies, Judah later than Israel.

When the Northern Kingdom, Israel, repeatedly ignored the ways and warnings of God for generations, they were given over to their enemies. The Assyrians conquered the 10 tribes of the Northern Kingdom of Israel. Though some individuals may have resettled or preserved their identity, most were scattered and permanently assimilated into their new homelands. They have been largely lost to history, though the Bible speaks of their return or identification, maybe symbolically, at the end of time in the book of Revelation.

<u>THE ROOTS OF THE SAMARITANS:</u> The handful of Israelites that remained in the land intermarried with the pagan nations that moved in and replaced them. They practiced a mixture of religions that ignored the purity and holiness of God. They built unauthorized places of worship and developed new systems and rituals that blended true worship with false worship.

This was offensive to the Jews (the Southern Kingdom of Judah) that eventually resettled next door after their own exile. They had been overtaken by the Babylonians (597/586BC) but were later restored to their homeland (539BC) and, in many ways, attempted to embrace reforms that would honor God as they rebuilt Jerusalem, their Temple, and the system of worship prescribed by God.
