Study Notes (Deuteronomy 14:1-29)



<u>Chapter 14:1-2</u> **Identity: How We Face Life.**

- <u>o</u> (Vv.1-2) God makes all the difference in our lives- yet, what does this mean? They were not to mark themselves like surrounding cultures that do not know God yet. They are a people of hope.
 - Set Apart / A holy people.
 - Chosen as a treasured possession.

• See -> <u>Acts 13:1-3</u>

Chapter 14:3-21 To Eat or Not to Eat.

- o (v.3) This section can bring fatigue to the reader. However, I want to invite you to see the context of what is happening here. God is inviting His adopted children to His table; to eat only what is good enough for Him.
- o (Vv.4-20) As we read through this list for Israel, remember they are learning what it means to be a part of God's family. Life is different for them now than when they were slaves in Egypt.
- o (v.21a) This showed Israel the contrast of being in verses outside of God's family. Rather than a means to pride, an invitation through the reason one can and cannot eat something.
- (v.21b) The bond of family is of great value to God; a mother and child share something that was not even to be disregarded in the animal kingdom.

<u>Chapter 14:22-29</u> **Tithing- the Joy of Giving and Loving**

- (Vv.22-26) This act of tithing existed before God instituted this with Israel.
 This was an act recognizing ultimately all things belong to a higher power (other cultures); for Israel this was God.
 - See -> Genesis 14:20
- o (Vv.27-29) The tithe would look out for the Levites whose sole role in Israel was to minister to the Congregation as well as looking out for those taking refuge in Israel, the orphan, and the widow. In this rhythm they would be blessed by God to be His blessing each other.
 - See -> James 1:27


