"Courageous Faith: Taking the First Step"

Joshua 1:1-9

Mission: "To serve as a beacon of God's love, striving to be the hands and feet of Jesus, shining His light for all to see."

Sermon Introduction:

Our spiritual journey mirrors the experience of learning to ride a bike, especially in the initial stages when we grapple with where to fix our gaze. Just as focusing solely on the mechanics of biking can lead to struggle, so too can being self-focused and fixating on our own efforts to connect with God create unnecessary turmoil. As we delve into Joshua 1:1-9, we're reminded to redirect our focus to Jesus, the ultimate destination of our faith journey.

A. Transition and Courageous Faith (Joshua 1:1)

- 1. Moses' passing signifies a transition for Israel, which can be likened to transitions we may face in our lives.
- 2. Embracing seasons of change requires courageous faith, as seen in Joshua's example.
- 3. Just as Joshua was commissioned to step out in faith, we are called to do the same (Matthew 28:19-20).

B. God's Promises for Victory (Joshua 1:2)

- 1. Reflecting on God's promise of victory to Joshua extends beyond his time, resonating with the assurance of victory in Christ.

- 2. Similarly, we cultivate strength and courage in faith, knowing that God's Spirit empowers us (2 Timothy 1:7).

- 1. Joshua is instructed to prioritize obedience for success and blessing, highlighting the importance of aligning with God's will.
- 2. Aligning our lives with God's Word through obedience is crucial for navigating transitions and challenges.
