Joshua's Last Words: Choose Who You Will Serve Joshua 23-24

Introduction: Joshua imparts his final message to the Israelites, emphasizing God's faithfulness and leading them in renewing their covenant with Him. Joshua's example offers a blueprint for us to regularly remember and recommit ourselves to God.

I. Joshua's Final Address to Israel (Joshua 23)

- A. Reminder of God's Faithfulness
 - 1. Joshua 23:3-5: Joshua reminds the Israelites how God has fought for them and given them victory over their enemies.
 - God's faithfulness in driving out nations and fulfilling His promises.
 - 2. Hebrews 13:8 "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever."

 - Historical examples: the fall of Jerusalem, which shows the consequences of disobedience.
 - 2. Galatians 6:7-8 "Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows."

II. Joshua's Covenant Renewal at Shechem (Joshua 24)

A. Recollection of Israel's History

- 1. Joshua 24:1-13: Joshua recounts God's acts of faithfulness
 - God's providence and guidance through generations.
- 2. Reflect on how God has worked in your own life and community, acknowledging His guidance and blessings.
- B. The Challenge: Choose This Day Whom You Will Serve
 - 1. Joshua 24:14-15: Joshua challenges the Israelites to fear the Lord and serve Him with all faithfulness. He declares, "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."
 - 2. Call to Decision: Making a clear and deliberate choice to serve God wholeheartedly.
 - 3. Matthew 6:24 "No one can serve two masters... You cannot serve both God and money."

 - 2. Joshua 24:19-28: Joshua establishes the covenant, sets up a stone as a witness, and records the agreement in the Book of the Law of God.
 - 3. Hebrews 10:23-25 "Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess... And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds." This encourages the community to remain steadfast in their faith and support one another.
