



Subject: Critical Teaching: We Are in the Season of the End Times

Dear Emmanuel Family,

I pray this message finds you walking in the Spirit and watching with anticipation for our Lord's return. This teaching on prophetic events was one of the most urgent messages the Holy Spirit has laid upon my heart in years. After postponing this teaching for five years, God made it unmistakably clear through divine confirmation—including the appearance of the number 666 in two separate instances—that NOW is the appointed time to position the church for what lies ahead.

**Summary:** The sermon explored the undeniable biblical, historical, and current evidence that we are living in the season of Christ's return. Through systematic examination of Matthew 24, Daniel's prophecy, and present-day events—particularly the role of Corona as God's instrument to psychologically prepare the world for the Antichrist's system—we established that the rapture is imminent. This teaching was not speculation but 95% factual data showing how communication, financial, and religious sectors are converging toward a one-world order, exactly as Scripture prophesied. The generation that began with Israel's rebirth in 1948 has not passed, and before it does, all end-time events must be fulfilled.

#### Takeaways:

- **We are commanded to WATCH and PRAY.** God doesn't want that day to catch us unaware (Luke 21:34-36). The season is here—Israel was reborn May 14, 1948; the temple plans are ready; priests are training; Corona has conditioned the world to accept restrictions on buying and selling without compliance (foreshadowing the mark of the beast). These are not coincidences but divine signs demanding our attention.
- **Corona is the vehicle ushering in the end times.** With a numeric value of 66 and being a six-letter word (666), Corona has accomplished what seemed impossible: globally conditioning people to want mandatory interventions and accept restrictions on commerce. More viruses with mandated responses are coming. This is preparing the world's mindset for the Antichrist's system where no one can buy or sell without his mark.

- **Good Christians won't miss the rapture because they're dirty or filthy—they'll miss it because of spots and wrinkles.** God is coming for a church without spot or wrinkle (Ephesians 5:27). Women of God: adorn yourselves with meekness and quietness, ornaments of great price to God, not outward adornments. Husbands: dwell with your wives according to knowledge, as saviors of the body, not kings. These may seem like small matters, but they are major concerns to God as He prepares His bride.

The cares of this life, the weight you're carrying, the things you're holding onto—none of it is worth missing the rapture. I implore you: let go of what hinders you. The temple drawings exist today. Levitical priests are in training today. Nations are negotiating over the Temple Mount today. When you hear that the Muslim-controlled site has been released to the Palestinian Jews to rebuild Solomon's Temple, know that time has run out.

Watch and pray, beloved. Our redemption draws nigh.

## 5-Day Devotional: Watching and Waiting for Christ's Return

### Day 1: The Season of Watchfulness

**Reading:** Matthew 24:32-44

**Devotional:** Jesus commands us not just to wait, but to watch. Like a fig tree signaling summer's approach, current events signal the nearness of Christ's return. We may not know the day or hour, but God expects us to discern the season. This isn't about fear—it's about readiness. Are the cares of this life drowning out your spiritual alertness? Corona and global shifts aren't random; they're divine orchestrations preparing the world for end-time events. Today, pause and ask: Am I watching? Am I praying? Or am I caught up in surfeiting and life's distractions? Your redemption draws near. Position yourself in prayerful awareness, keeping your spiritual eyes open to what God is revealing in these extraordinary times.

### Day 2: Israel—God's Prophetic Timepiece

**Reading:** Amos 9:14-15; Jeremiah 30:1-7

**Devotional:** Israel's rebirth on May 14, 1948, wasn't a political accident—it was prophetic fulfillment. For centuries, the Jewish people were scattered, but God promised restoration. When they returned to their land, a prophetic clock began ticking. This generation shall not pass until all things are fulfilled. We're living in that generation. God's faithfulness to Israel demonstrates His faithfulness to every promise He's made to you. Just as He brought the Jews back to their homeland despite impossible odds, He will complete what He's begun in your life. The same God who orchestrates nations orchestrates your destiny. Trust His timing. Watch His movements. He is faithful to finish what He starts.

## Day 3: Adorned for the Bridegroom

**Reading:** Ephesians 5:25-27; 1 Peter 3:3-4

**Devotional:** Christ is returning for a bride without spot or wrinkle—not dirty, but unblemished. For women especially, God calls you to adorn yourselves with meekness and quietness, ornaments of great price in His sight. This isn't about legalism; it's about representing the purity of Christ's church. Every believer must examine what adorns their life. Are you decorated with humility, gentleness, and a peaceful spirit, or with the temporary trappings of this world? The wedding is approaching. The Bridegroom has sent His invitation. Your preparation matters. Strip away what dims your spiritual radiance. Clothe yourself in the beauty that never fades—the beauty of a surrendered heart, transformed by grace and ready for His appearing.

## Day 4: Husbands as Saviors, Not Kings

**Reading:** Ephesians 5:22-33; 1 Peter 3:7

**Devotional:** God calls husbands to be saviors of their households, not kings. There's a profound difference. Kings demand; saviors serve. Kings rule; saviors redeem. As Christ gave Himself for the church, husbands must dwell with their wives according to knowledge—understanding their needs, honoring their fragility, loving sacrificially. This isn't weakness; it's Christlikeness. In these urgent times, family unity matters more than ever. The enemy seeks to divide homes, but godly husbands build spiritual fortresses through servant leadership. Examine your heart: Are you leading with authority or with love? Are you protecting or dominating? Christ is coming soon. Let your marriage reflect His relationship with the church—sacrificial, honoring, and redemptive. Your home is a witness to a watching world.

## Day 5: Enduring Until the End

**Reading:** Matthew 24:13; Jeremiah 30:7; Luke 21:34-36

**Devotional:** "He that endures to the end shall be saved." These aren't empty words—they're a divine promise for turbulent times. We're entering the season Jesus described, when deception increases and love grows cold. But endurance isn't passive survival; it's active faithfulness.

Watch and pray always, that you may be accounted worthy to escape what's coming. Don't let your heart be overcharged with life's cares. Corona has revealed how quickly normalcy vanishes. More challenges await. But God hasn't left you defenseless. He's positioned you to stand firm. Strengthen your prayer life. Deepen your biblical knowledge. Guard your heart against complacency. The finish line is visible. Run with endurance the race set before you, knowing your Redeemer stands ready to receive you home.
