Chapter 9 - The Genealogy of the Remnant

(v1-9) Genealogy of the Twelve Tribes Who Returned

(v.2 - NETHINIM [NEHTH uh neam] — a group of people of non-Jewish background who served as Temple servants in Old Testament times. As assistants to the <u>LEVITES</u>, they performed such menial chores as cleaning the Temple, carrying water and wood to the altar, and scrubbing utensils used in the sacrificial ceremonies. Some of the Nethinim returned to Jerusalem with Ezra after the <u>CAPTIVITY (Ezra 7:7)</u>.)

Chapter 10 - "The Death of King Saul"

Trivia Question: Who killed King Saul?

(v1-10) Saul's Fight (<u>Dagon</u> - In Canaanite mythological texts Baal is sometimes called the son of Dagon. Dagon (<u>Judg 16:23; 1 Sam 5:2-7; 1 Chron 10:10</u>) was the chief god of the ancient Philistines, a grain and fertility god whose most famous temples were at Gaza and Ashdod. With the recent discovery of documents at ancient <u>EBLA</u> in Syria, it is clear that Dagon, or Dagan, was a much more ancient and prominent god. These texts show that Dagon was being worshiped before Abraham entered Canaan about <u>2000 B.C.</u> Dagon continued to be worshiped by the Canaanites up to the time of Christ.)

(v11-14) Saul's "Folly"

> Four keys to Saul's failure:

#1- Saul's unfaithfulness

#2- Saul did not keep the Word of God

Deut 10:12-13- "And now, Israel, what does the LORD your God require of you, but to fear the LORD your God, to walk in all His ways and to love Him, to serve the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and to keep the commandments of the LORD and His statutes which I command you today for your good?

#3- Saul consulted a medium

Lev 19:31- Give no regard to mediums and familiar spirits; do not seek after them, to be defiled by them: I am the LORD your God.

#4- Saul did not inquire of God (Something to think about- Acts ch. 5)
