<u>The Book of HEBREWS</u> <u>Chapter 7</u> "Jesus, The King/Priest of Righteousness & Peace"

I) HONOR THE KING/PRIEST OF RIGHTEOUSNESS (v1-10)

(v1) Understanding Melchizedek & Abraham- Gen 14:18-20- Then Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine. He was priest of God Most High, and he blessed Abram, saying, "Blessed be Abram by God Most High, Creator of heaven and earth. And blessed be God Most High, who delivered your enemies into your hand." Then Abram gave him a tenth of everything.

(v4-10) How to honor the King/Priest: (1) Abraham honored Melchizedek with tenth of the spoils;

(2) Levites received tithes from the people to honor God- Leviticus 18:25-26- Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak thus to the Levites, and say to them: 'When you take from the children of Israel the tithes which I have given you from them as your inheritance, then you shall offer up a heave offering of it to the LORD, a tenth of the tithe; (3) How do New Testament Christians honor God in their giving?

> Tithing simply defined: In the <u>Old Testament</u> the purpose of the giving of a tenth was to meet the material need of the Levite, the stranger, the fatherless (the orphan), and the widow (Deut 26:12-13). The tithe was an expression of gratitude to God by His people. Basic to tithing was the acknowledgment of God's ownership of everything in the earth.

In the <u>New Testament</u> believers are to be generous in sharing our material possessions with the poor and for the support of Christian ministry. Christ Himself is our model in giving. Giving is to be voluntary, willing, cheerful, and given in the light of our accountability to God. Giving should be systematic and by no means limited to a tithe of our incomes. We recognize that all we have is from God. We are called to be faithful stewards of all our possessions. (from Nelson's Illustrated Bible Dictionary, Copyright (c)1986, Thomas Nelson Publishers)

Priority #1- We need the <u>right heart!</u>- Luke 18:9-14- Also He spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others: Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank You that I am not like other men--extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Priority #2- Be a diligent giver- 1 Cor 16:1-2- Now about the collection for God's people: Do what I told the Galatian churches to do. On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income, saving it up, so that when I come no collections will have to be made.

Priority #3- Be a <u>cheerful</u> giver- 2 Cor 9:6-7- But this I say: He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver.

Priority #4- Wisdom of the ages "Honor Him & He will <u>bless</u> you"- Prov 3:9-14- Honor the LORD with your possessions, And with the firstfruits of all your increase; So your barns will be filled with plenty, And your vats will overflow with new wine. My son, do not despise the chastening of the LORD, Nor detest His correction; For whom the LORD loves He corrects, Just as a father the son in whom he delights. Happy is the man who finds wisdom, And the man who gains understanding; For her proceeds are better than the profits of silver, And her gain than fine gold.

II) JESUS, OUR KING/PRIEST FOREVER (v11-22)

(v17 & 21) Quoting King David in Psalm 110 as he refers to Melchizedek.

(v22) "a <u>better</u> covenant"- Abraham by faith, not by law-Rom 4:13-17- It was not through law that Abraham and his offspring received the promise that he would be heir of the world, but through the righteousness that comes by faith. For if those who live by law are heirs, faith has no value and the promise is worthless, because law brings wrath. And where there is no law there is no transgression. Therefore, the promise comes by faith, so that it may be by grace and may be guaranteed to all Abraham's offspring-not only to those who are of the law but also to those who are of the faith of Abraham. He is the father of us all. As it is written: "I have made you a father of many nations." He is our father in the sight of God, in whom he believed-the God who gives life to the dead and calls things that are not as though they were.

III) RECEIVE THE KING/PRIEST'S PEACE (v23-28)

(v25,26) -"He is able to <u>save</u> to the uttermost" - (Prostitutes, Adulterers, Thieves, Murderers, even tax collectors, etc.) John 3:17-19- For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because he has not believed in the name of God's one and only Son.

-"He always lives to make intercession for us"- (i.e. – Read Jesus High Priestly prayer in John 17) -"He died once for all"... "perfected forever"-

Conclusion: Revelation 1:4-6- Grace and peace to you from him who is, and who was, and who is to come, and from the seven spirits before his throne, and from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth. To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood, and has made us to be a kingdom and priests to serve his God and Father-to him be glory and power for ever and ever! Amen.
