

## <u>The Gospel According To JOHN</u> <u>Chapter 15:7-27</u> "<u>THE FRUITFUL LIFE!</u>"

~ <u>In this chapter Jesus yields four insights to a FANTASTIC FRUITFUL LIFE!</u> > <u>Insight #1 – LET'S HAVE FRUITFUL PRAYERS! (v7-8)</u> > <u>Insight #2 – LET'S HAVE FRUITFUL LOVE AND JOY!</u> (v9-14) > <u>Insight #3 – LET'S HAVE FRUITFUL FRIENDSHIPS!</u> (v15-17 > <u>Insight #4 – LET'S HAVE A FRUITFUL WITNESS! (v18-27)</u>

> <u>Insight #1 – LET'S HAVE FRUITFUL PRAYERS! (v7-8)</u> (v7-8) "<u>ASK what you desire and, and it shall be done for you</u>" - This incredible promise for answered prayer will come to fruition as we abide in Christ and pray according to His Word. Jesus gives the secret to this answered prayer in John 15:8 - <u>By this My Father is glorified</u>, that you bear much fruit; <u>so you will be My disciples</u>.

~ <u>We read in</u>:

John 14:13 – "And whatever you ask in <u>My name</u>, that I will do, that <u>the</u> <u>Father may be glorified in the Son."</u>

John 15:16-17 – "You did not choose Me, <u>but I chose you and appointed</u> you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that <u>whatever you ask the Father in My name</u> He may give you."

John 16:23-24 - "And in that day you will ask Me nothing. Most assuredly, I say to you, <u>whatever you ask the Father in My name He will</u> <u>give you</u>. Until now you have asked nothing in My name. Ask, and you will receive, <u>that your joy may be full</u>."

- The words pray, prayers, or prayed are found 232 times in the Scriptures. Jesus said in Luke 18:8 - "<u>Nevertheless, when the Son of Man</u> <u>comes, will He really find faith on the earth?</u>"

~ <u>For what do you need to pray?</u>

- A better marriage or desiring to find that special someone to marry.
- > To overcome a sinful habit.
- > Salvation, to know you are forgiven, or to have peace in your life.

- > For a wayward child, or grandchild.
- > Maybe you need healing (physical, emotional, mental, spiritual).
- > Maybe a financial difficulty.
- > A closer relationship with Jesus, boldness to witness.

## > <u>Insight #2 – LET'S HAVE FRUITFUL LOVE AND JOY!</u> (v9-14)

(v9-10) <u>LOVE</u> - In respect of *agapao* as used of God, it expresses the deep and constant "love" and interest of a perfect Being towards entirely unworthy objects, producing and fostering a reverential "love" in them towards the Giver, and a practical "love" towards those who are partakers of the same, and a desire to help others to seek the Giver. (from Vine's Expository Dictionary of Biblical Words)

- Jesus said in John 3:16 - "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

- <u>Paul wrote Romans 5:8</u> - But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

- John shared in 1 John 4:9-10 - This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. 10 This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.

- <u>True LOVE is defined in 1 Corinthians 13:4-8</u> - Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails.

(v11-12) <u>Let us talk Biblical JOY:</u> (Joy, rejoice, rejoices, rejoicing, happy are found 421 times in the Bible, Christianity is an exuberance of mega JOY!)

- JOY defined in the Nelson's Bible dictionary reads as follows: A positive attitude or pleasant emotion; delight. Many kinds of joy are reported in the Bible. This makes it difficult to give a simple definition of joy. Even the wicked are said to experience joy in their triumphs over the righteous (1 Cor 13:6; Rev 11:10). Many levels of joy are also described, including gladness, contentment, and cheerfulness.

But the joy which the people of God should have is holy and pure. This joy rises above circumstances and focuses on the very character of God. In the Psalms, for example, the psalmist rejoices over God's righteousness (71:14-16), salvation (21:1; 71:23), mercy (31:7), creation (148:5), word (119:14,162), and faithfulness (33:1-6). God's characteristics as well as His acts are the cause of rejoicing.

The joy required of the righteous person (Ps 150; Phil 4:4) is produced by the Spirit of God (Gal 5:22). This kind of joy looks beyond the present to our future salvation (Rom 5:2; 8:18; 1 Peter 1:4,6) and to our sovereign God, who works out all things for our ultimate good, which is Christlikeness (Rom 8:28-30). This kind of joy is distinct from mere happiness. Joy like this is possible, even in the midst of sorrow (1 Cor 12:26; 2 Cor 6:10; 7:4).

~ The Scriptures speak of:

- <u>His Joy</u> - Hebrews 12:1-2 - *Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, <u>who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross</u>, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.* 

- <u>Our Joy in God</u> - Psalm 16:11- You will show me the p5ath of life; <u>in Your</u> <u>presence is fullness of joy</u>; at Your right hand are pleasures forevermore.

- <u>Our Joy in Prayer</u> - John 16:22-24-*Therefore you now have sorrow; <u>but</u> <u>I will see you again and your heart will rejoice, and your joy no one will</u> <u>take from you</u>. And in that day you will ask Me nothing. Most assuredly, I say to you, whatever you ask the Father in My name He will give you. Until now you have asked nothing in My name. <u>Ask, and you will receive,</u> <u>that your joy may be full</u>.* 

- <u>Our Joy in the Holy Spirit</u> - Romans 14:17 - the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, <u>but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy</u> <u>Spirit</u>.

- <u>Our Joy in the Word of God</u> - Jeremiah 15:16 - Your words were found, and I ate them, <u>and Your word was to me the joy and rejoicing of my heart;</u> For I am called by Your name, O LORD God of hosts. - <u>Our Joy in evangelism</u> - Acts 8:5-8 - Then Philip went down to the city of Samaria and preached Christ to them. And the multitudes with one accord heeded the things spoken by Philip, hearing and seeing the miracles which he did. For unclean spirits, crying with a loud voice, came out of many who were possessed; and many who were paralyzed and lame were healed. <u>And there was great jo+ in that city</u>.

(v13-14) SACRIFICE - Revelation Ch. 5 - "The lamb who was slain"

## > <u>Insight #3 – LET'S HAVE FRUITFUL FRIENDSHIPS!</u> (v15-17)

(v15) "<u>you are my friends</u>" - <u>Abraham</u> - James 3:21-24 - Was not Abraham our father justified by works when he offered Isaac his son on the altar? Do you see that faith was working together with his works, and by works faith was made perfect? And the Scripture was fulfilled which says, "Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness." <u>And he was called the friend of God. You see then that a</u> <u>man is justified by works, and not by faith only.</u>

~ Proverbs speaks of good friends in:

- <u>Proverbs 17:17</u> - "A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for adversity"

- <u>Proverbs 18:24</u> - "A man of many companions may come to ruin, but there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother"

- <u>Proverbs 27:6</u> - "Wounds from a friend can be trusted, but an enemy multiplies kisses"

- Proverbs 27:17 - "As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another"

(v16-17) Warren Wiersbe writes, "How is it possible for Jesus to command us to love one another? Can true love be commanded? You must keep in mind that Christian love is not basically a "feeling"; <u>it is an act of the will. The proof of our love is not in our feelings but in our</u> <u>actions, even to the extent of laying down our lives for Christ and for</u> <u>one another</u> (1 John 3:16). Jesus laid down His life for both His friends and His enemies! (Rom 5:10) While the emotions are certainly involved, <u>real Christian love is an act of the will. It means treating others the way</u> <u>God treats us</u>. So, our friendship with Christ involves love and obedience."

> Insight #4 – LET'S HAVE A FRUITFUL WITNESS! (v18-27)
- Like in Acts 5:28-42- "Fill your city with Jesus!"
