 - b.** What does your fear, fateful arrogance, or faith say about what you (truly) believe about who God is and what He is like?
 - c.** T.A. said that when you think you are strong, that is when are truly weak, but when you are weak, you open the door to being strong. What do you think that means?
- 3.** How should the gospel, the fact that Jesus defeated the enemies of Satan, sin, and death for us and that we can experience victory when we put our trust in Him, eradicate fear and fateful arrogance and build your faith in your life and leadership?
- 4.** How can you fight for a big view of God every day this week
