- 2. Pastor Dan made the point that pride is what keeps us from seeing the reality of our sinful nature. Have you experienced this to be true? How have recent events made you more aware of your own sinfulness?
- 3. How have you engaged in the conversation of racial reconciliation in the last few weeks? If you haven't, what do you think could be holding you back?
- 4. In recent weeks, it seems like more and more people have become aware of the sin of racism that has infected our country. Praise God! What changes do you hope to see as a result of this heightened awareness?
- 5. Pastor Dan said "None of us are responsible for the world we are born into, but we are responsible for what we do with that world throughout the course of our lives" As Christians, how can we lead the charge in producing lasting change, particularly when it comes to the fight against racial injustice?
