- 1. **Intro**: Without using names to avoid gossip, describe a time when you observed someone, perhaps especially a Christian, whose activity did not match up with their identity. How did that affect you?
- 2. **Read James 1:18**. Why do you think it is important to understand our new identity in Christ before considering our new activity of hearing and doing the word?
- 3. **Read James 1:19-21**. How would you describe the relationship between humility, listening, anger, and receiving the word, and how does that convict or challenge you?
- 4. Read James 1:21-25.
 - a. What motivation does James give for being a doer of the word and not a hearer only, and how does that inspire you personally to want to grow in your engagement with the word?
 - b. What practical difference should knowing that the goal is to be a doer of the word make in your approach to the word? How does that compare and/or contrast to your typical motivation for engaging with the word?
 - c. What is a practical step you can take to grow in hearing and doing the word this week?

QUESTIONS FOR KIDS

- 1. Read James 1:19. What should we be slow to do? What should we be quick to do? Why?
- 2. **Read James 1:22**. What is the difference between hearing the word of God and hearing the word of God and doing what it says?
- 3. Pray and ask God to make you hungry for His word!
