## **Application Questions**

1.	Is there anything currently in your life that is contributing to thoughts that are unholy, or unacceptable according to this passage? (i.e. Books, movies, music, relationships, etc.) What is the Lord telling you to do to remove whatever is tripping you up? How serious are you about holiness?
2.	Since we need to have our minds continually renewed, what practical things could you do to ensure that the "word of Christ is dwelling in you richly" according to Colossians 3:16?
3.	In 1 Corinthians 15:33, Paul tells us that "bad company corrupts good morals." Why is it important to be friends with godly examples? Who in your life is providing a model for you to emulate?
4.	Since the Holy Spirit always intends to convict us of sin, we will often have a guilty conscience and lack of peace. In order to gain the promise of peace according to verse 9, what are we to do when the Spirit does bring about conviction? (see 1 Thessalonians 5:19)  What should be the process of "walking in the Spirit"?
