- **Main Point:** As we await Jesus' future return, He has specific words of affirmation, admonishment, and assurance for us His church right now, revealing Himself in all His glory as the blessed remedy we need.
- Revelation, for many people, is:
 - Confusing
 - Strange
 - Scary
 - Exclusive
 - Ethereal
 - Futuristic
 - Unimportant
 - Debated

Things to remember regarding the book of Revelation:

- 1. This is meant to be Understood!
- 2. This is for you!
- 3. This matters, and matters now!
- 4. This provides an incredible blessing!

What is Jesus speaking to you today? What is your spiritual condition?

- **Ephesus** Has my love for Jesus and his people grown cold? Is there a time when it was stronger than now?
- Smyrna Am I willing to suffer for Jesus without relief, or do I need to adjust my expectations away from a life protected from suffering?
- <u>Pergamum</u> Where is there compromise that threatens my relationship with Jesus and witness for Jesus - in the entertainment I consume, the moral standards I hold, the laxness of sexual purity, the money I spend, the time and attention I give to media, politics, hobbies, and other escapes?
- <u>Thyatira</u> Have I been seduced by voices that twist Scripture and justify sin and idolatry? What teaching am I unwisely tolerating?
- <u>Sardis</u> Do I appear more spiritual and holy on the outside than I am on the inside? Is my soul and relationship with God more dead than alive?
- **Philadelphia** Am I persisting in unseen faithfulness to Jesus, or am I caught in the trap of seeking recognition or position for my devotion?
- <u>Laodicea</u> Has material comfort and stability lulled me to self-sufficiency, indifference, and blindness spiritually?
