


The Session was led in a devotional by elder John Bullard.



Enlightening Conversations: Communities Uniting Against Racism

Far too often, we hear disturbing news reports or read unsettling stories about racially motivated incidents. We may feel overwhelmed at times by the bad news. We may wonder if there is any positive news to be found and where we would find it. Surely there are people working together to build a more loving and tolerant society. But where are they? Where can we go to share our stories and engage in open and honest dialogue about the effects of racism? How can we build a more inclusive and loving community?

Look no further. Right here in Moore County you will have an opportunity to join in a series of Enlightening Conversations about Communities Uniting Against Racism.

West Southern Pines Civic Club and the Bold Initiative Team of Brownson Memorial Presbyterian Church are sponsoring this 10-week series on Zoom beginning September 12 through November 14. Each Tuesday session will take place from 6:30-8 PM. The series is free of charge and open to all.

Each week will feature a video of our Moore County neighbors followed by small break-out sessions where we can share our stories, attitudes, and reflections on racism. Conversations will take place in a safe and respectful atmosphere in which everyone can engage in honest and open dialogue. It will be a space where we can listen non-judgmentally and develop greater understanding and acceptance of others.

By engaging in these Enlightening Conversations, we can create positive news stories about race relations in Moore County, North Carolina, that will carry us forward with a renewed sense of hope and purpose.

The West Southern Pines Civic Club was established in 1943 to improve the quality of life for Black citizens of Southern Pines. Kim Wade serves as the current president.





A Bit of History

The Women's Auxiliary of Brownson Memorial Presbyterian Church, now known as Presbyterian Women, was organized on the afternoon of March 19, 1936, at the home of Mrs. R. S. DuRant, also first Moderator. Bible Study and Missions have always been central to PW throughout the history of Brownson. With approximately 100 members, today's PW continues their focus on Bible Study with "Sacred Encounters": "Jesus and Jesus' disciples who shared the Good News through sacred encounters with everyday people." Visitation Ministry



For this edition of the Bells, I would love to highlight the work of our Visitation Ministry Team! This team visits our homebound members, offering care and connection to those who can no longer physically attend church. This work is so important to the life of the church. Through their visits, our Visitation Ministry Team ensures that homebound members are still connected to the life of the church, and are still a part of the church family, offering a visible sign of Christ's love and care for all people. Visitors are typically partnered with one or two homebound members who they commit to seeing once or twice a month. Through this continuity of care, meaningful relationships are developed between visitors and their partners.

A new resource that the Visitation Team offers is our monthly Visitation bulletin and quarterly visitation devotional. These materials provide scripture, artwork, prayers, and hymns in an easy-to-read format tailored to the needs of our members who may be dealing with memory loss and/or difficulty reading. Even if you are not a member of the Visitation Team, you are welcome to pick up a bulletin or devotional from the church office to share with someone you think would benefit from these materials.


If you know of a family still looking for a preschool home, please have them reach out! We still have openings in our PreK/four-year-old program and would love to connect with them. Scholarships are also available.



Spiritual Direction groups?

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

It is a joy and privilege for me to offer members of Brownson an opportunity to meet in a small group for Spiritual Direction this fall. We will begin with two groups of four people and will meet once a month for four months. Each meeting will last about two hours. This is an "experiment" to see if God is leading us into this spiritual practice as a church family.

These groups will be "safe space." Everything said in these meetings will be held confidentially among the people in the group. It is not a book study, or a Bible study, but an opportunity for Spirit-centered Soul Care of ourselves. My impression of the Brownson community is that there are many hard-working and self-sacrificing servants of the Lord Jesus Christ. If you are like me, we sometimes reach a point on our spiritual journeys when we are empty and need to be re-filled with God's living water. That is the purpose for these groups.

We will practice silence, prayerful listening, and spiritual discernment together. Each person's voice will be heard and valued. We will not be giving advice to each other, trying to fix someone else's problem, or solve dilemmas. We will be listening to the voice of the Holy Spirit at work in each other's lives. Our commitment will last four months: September – December 2023. I do not know yet the days or times when we will meet but will be open to suggestions about what would work for the individuals who sign up for these two groups.

The image of "Bursting Forth" is an expression of my own Soul Care. I attended a weekend retreat at the Trinity Center in Emerald Isle where Ally Markotich and Monica Hix co-facilitated a retreat on the theme: "Mothering Myself." Bursting Forth wrote me a letter from which I will share a brief quote:

"Sweet Sue, be you. As yourself, you are a gift. Let go of the Spirit-bird in your hands from your deepest self and let her fly free....


Others can rest in your embracing nest to find solace, affirmation, to renew, refill. You can be a portal, a spicket of grace for others, as well as for yourself. Spray the hose of my endless love and grace back upon yourself, as the glistening drops of water sparkle in the sunlight. Nest of grace, soul on fire, be Sue; be you! You are 'fireworks.'"

Brownson Local Missions
