## OUR COOPERATION WITH GOD'S OPERATION URGENTLY NEEDED TO END THIS AGE

## Message Five

John 15:2, 6; Matt. 26:25-30; 2 Tim 4:1-2, 5; John 15:11; Phil. 4:1

## V. To cooperate with God's operation, we must have an aggressive desperation in order to experience the glory and joy of bearing fruit:

- A. We must wake up from our numb situation and see that bearing fruit is a very serious matter, with consequences now and in the next age—John 15:2, 6; Matt. 25:14-30:
  - 1. To have an aggressive desperation, we need to wake up and be "crazy," like persons in a burning building, willing to jump out of a window.
  - 2. Our attitude should be to do anything and everything that it takes to get someone saved and baptized.
  - 3. We should not say there is no way; there is a way, and the Lord has shown us the way; He has dedicated this way; He has cut this way.
  - 4. We may be good saints, not doing anything wrong, not losing anything, keeping what the Lord has given us throughout the years.
  - 5. This is not sufficient; the Lord wants interest, the fruit; He will ask concerning this at His appearing.
  - 6. Paul solemnly charged Timothy by the Lord's appearing and His kingdom (2 Tim. 4:1) to proclaim the word (v. 2) and to do the work of an evangelist (v. 5).
  - 7. We need to be serious; this will keep us from backsliding and being slothful.
  - 8. May we all be serious and aggressively desperate; one day He will see us, and we will meet Him.
  - 9. We will have to give Him an account, and He will decide whether we receive a reward or a punishment in the coming kingdom; this is a solemn thing.
  - 10. "As a human being, I must believe in the Lord Jesus; as a believer, I must love Him; and as one who loves Him, I must bear fruit; this is serious" (*The Collected Works of Witness Lee, 1987*, vol. 1, "Being Desperate and Living Uniquely for the Gospel," p. 42).
- B. The first crucial item of God's operation on the earth is gospel preaching, the Godordained way of preaching the gospel:
  - 1. We may like abiding in the vine, in Christ, in John 15, enjoying the unsearchable riches of the vine.
  - 2. John 15 stresses fruit-bearing even more, and if we bear fruit, the Father will be glorified:
    - a. He will not be glorified just by our abiding.
    - b. He will be glorified only if we are bearing fruit, that is, men, because only fruit-bearing can release the Father's divine life; when we bear fruit the very divine life that is in the Son, the vine, is released.
  - 3. As we abide in the Son, we absorb the life that is in the vine, participating in the unsearchable riches of the vine's life-juice.
  - 4. Sooner or later, the life we have been absorbing will be released; the issue, the result of this enjoyable absorbing is fruit-bearing.
  - 5. It is this releasing of the life-juice that expresses God, glorifies Him; doing something good for God does not glorify Him, only bearing fruit.

- 6. The increase and enlargement of the vine is the Father's glorification.
- 7. To be branches of the divine vine and to bear fruit to express the divine life is a matter of joy—a joyful life; this is the genuine enjoyment we all want.
- 8. This experience of fruit-bearing may make us ecstatic because the Lord's very joy has become our joy—John 15:11.
- 9. In John 15:11 the Lord referred to our joy being made full; in 1 Thessalonians 2:19-20 Paul refers to our joy again; and this joy is the fruit that we bear.
- 10. Christ's joy is our joy, and the Father's glorification is our glorification; to Paul the fruit borne by him was his glory and his joy.
- 11. When the Lord comes back and we stand before Him, who will stand with us and for us? Our fruit.
- 12. This fruit will be our crown.
