The End: A Great Place to Start

Acts 15:36-41

"Winners never quit & quitters never win." All Coaches Everywhere

Main Idea: When I quit on God, God does not quit on me!

"And after some days Paul said to Barnabas, 'Let us return & visit the brothers in every city where we proclaimed the word of the Lord, & see how they are.' Now Barnabas wanted to take with them John called Mark. But Paul thought best not to take with them one who had withdrawn from them in Pamphylia & had not gone with them to the work. And there arose a sharp disagreement, so that they separated from each other. Barnabas took Mark with him & sailed away to Cyprus, but Paul chose Silas & departed, having been commended by the brothers to the grace of the Lord. And he went through Syria & Cilicia, strengthening the churches." Acts 15:36-41

Three Things to Remember about Quitters

I. God's Mission has been Advancing in Spite of Quitters

"And after some days Paul said to Barnabas, 'Let us return & visit the brothers in every city where we proclaimed the word of the Lord, & see how they are." **Acts 15:36**

- **Holy Spirit Comes** In Jerusalem, on the Day of Pentecost, when over 3,000 people were saved & baptized into the church (Acts 2).
- **Tensions Rise** In Jerusalem miracles are happening, people are getting saved every day & the Jewish establishment is concerned.
- **Stephen Killed** The 1st Christian martyr is stoned to death by the Sanhedrin (Jewish Court) & this breaks up the party in Jerusalem.

"Now those who were scattered went about preaching the word." Acts 8:4

"But when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face, because he stood condemned. For before certain men came from James, he was eating with the Gentiles; but when they came he drew back and separated himself, fearing the circumcision party. And the rest of the Jews acted hypocritically along with him, so that even Barnabas was led astray by their hypocrisy. But when I saw that their conduct was not in step with the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas before them all, 'If you, though a Jew, live like a Gentile and not like a Jew, how can you force the Gentiles to live like Jews?" Galatians 2:11-14

• **Jerusalem Council** – All the Apostles assemble to discuss how to disciple these non-Jews who wanted to follow Jesus.

"Therefore my judgment is that we should not trouble those of the Gentiles who turn to God." **Acts 15:19**

II. God Invites Quitters to Enjoy a Second Chance

"Now Barnabas wanted to take with them John called Mark. But Paul thought best not to take with them one who had withdrawn from them in Pamphylia & had not gone with them to the work. And there arose a sharp disagreement, so that they separated from each other." Acts 15:37-39a "Paul & Barnabas agreed on the importance of the trip, but they could not agree on the composition of the 'team."" **Warren Wiersbe**

"Paul looked at people & asked, 'What can they do for God's work?' while Barnabas looked at people & asked, 'What can God's work do for them?'" **Warren Wiersbe**

III. God's Mission will Move Forward through Those who Say Yes

"Barnabas took Mark with him & sailed away to Cyprus, but Paul chose Silas & departed, having been commended by the brothers to the grace of the Lord. And he went through Syria & Cilicia, strengthening the churches." **Acts 15:39b-41**
