

On October 4, 1958, a group of about 100 Christians from downtown Los Angeles sensed God's leading to begin a new church ministering to people in West LA. With a heavy burden on their hearts to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ and show God's love to this area of the city, the group purchased this land we stand on today in Playa del Rey and held their first worship service on August 30, 1959. We continue to believe that God deserves to be worshiped here and desire to reach out to the people of Los Angeles and those visiting this city, in order to show them how real He is and how amazing His love is for us all.



About our DRC Sunday Service | Easter Sunday | March 31, 2024

We truly believe that our time together on Sundays is special and life-transforming. Below is our general order of service as we worship God.

PRAYER, SCRIPTURE, & CHARITY. The service begins with a reading of scripture and go to Him in prayer, recognizing the One we have gathered to worship. God's mercies are new every morning. That said, as gives us grace we want to give to others, so we collect food for the poor in the wooden barrel as we enter church each week. Freely we receive and give.

SINGING TOGETHER. We joyously join together in song in praise of the Triune God. Singing helps us to connect our hearts and minds to God and it unites us as we rejoice in the gospel.

CHURCH NEWS / FELLOWSHIP. We give church announcements of important things that are happening in our congregation, of how to get involved, where you can serve, and how you can grow in faith/life.

STUDYING SCRIPTURE / HEARING GOD's WORD. We open God's word to study what it says and apply it. The Bible is God's self-disclosure to His people. It is a light unto our paths and sustenance for our souls.

RESPONDING IN SONG, COMMUNION, AND OFFERING: Having received God's word, we respond in worship by singing and coming forward to the communion table to partake in a cup of juice and bread, which are memorial pictures of the sacrifice of the incarnate Son of God, Jesus Christ, whose body was broken, and blood was shed for our redemption. On the communion tables there are charity boxes for giving offerings, which we joyfully and sacrificially give, along with our prayer/connection cards that are offered in the same box on the tables.

CLOSING PRAYER, FELLOWSHIP, & SCATTERING FOR MISSION. Having responded in repentance and faith to God's word by His Spirit, we close the service in prayer and make sure to linger to say hello as we leave to our calling as children of God to be witnesses of His love and grace.
