I. LORD OF YOUR WHOLE LIFE

- A. Jesus cannot be Lord of only part of your life, He must be Lord of your entire (1 [Thessalonians 5](#))
- B. Outer life is visible, public, seen and heard; who we are by reputation
- C. Inner life is who we are when no one is looking; deals with our character
- D. Jesus desires to be Lord of both inner and outer life
- E. [Proverbs 23:7](#), [Proverbs 4:23](#)
- F. The outward life often expresses the inward life
- G. What we are thinking, how we are maturing spiritually does express itself outwardly
 - 1. This is the incarnation of our sanctification
- H. Jesus is expressed not only by what we think but also by what we say and how we act
- I. The public life must be seen in the context of the whole life; it all relates
 - 1. "Has all of this truly come under Jesus' Lordship?"
 - 2. Is He Lord of your thoughts, emotions, speech, relationships, possessions?

II. WHAT DOES THIS INVOLVE?

- A. Absolute surrender; yield your life to Him
- B. An acknowledgment of His ownership (1 [Corinthians 6:19-20](#))
 - 1. We are not our own
- C. Total and complete obedience ([Luke 6:46](#))
- D. Our willing service
 - 1. Here I am Lord, send me
