Ephesians 4:7-16

SERMON SUMMARY:

As we consider Paul's next applications of the gospel in our passage today, Paul links a few important concepts together: The gospel, gifts, and maturity. An odd combination. Yet, when we consider how they go together, we will see that they are necessary ingredients for a healthy church.

SERMON OUTLINE:

A Common Problem

Showing up without growing up.

Grace For The Church

God's grace sets <u>captives free</u> and <u>equips</u> the church.

Spiritual gifts equip the church.

<u>Spiritual maturity</u> is the <u>goal</u> of the gifts.

Application

Be <u>equipped</u> so you can <u>edify others</u>.

Recognize <u>immaturity</u>, and take <u>responsibility</u> for becoming <u>mature</u>.

- What immaturity do you need to take ownership of, and what does bringing that to Jesus look like for you?
