THE LONG JOURNEY

Matthew 1:1-17

SERMON SUMMARY:

The story of Christmas can be summed up in John Dwight's lyric from *O Holy Night*, "the weary world rejoices." Though the Israelites were losing hope as the centuries passed, their weariness could not swallow their joy at Jesus' coming. Today we begin our Christmas series as we find ourselves in the same tension: holding on to hope in the midst of weariness.

SERMON OUTLINE:

The Journey Home

Just as a light in the window helps us see the end of the journey, <u>God's promises</u> were hope to his people in the midst of <u>weariness</u>.

Three Main Acts

<u>Abraham</u>: Jesus fulfilled the promise for a <u>great nation</u>. <u>David</u>: Jesus fulfilled the promise for a <u>true king</u>. <u>Exile</u>: Jesus fulfilled the promise for a <u>deliverer</u>.

Application

Interpret each moment in light of God's grand story.

Cultivate hope by clinging to God's promises.
