



# JESUS *is* LORD

**Jesus is Lord**– Romans 10:5-13

March 31, 2024

Our weekend of Easter celebration concluded by witnessing 6 new believers testify that that 'Jesus is Lord'.

Listen now as Lewis Roderick takes us to Romans 10 and shows us what this simple phrase means, and why believing it will change your life.

For personal reflection/community discussion

**Read** – Read the passage in its context several times. Read it slow enough to understand what God is saying through it.

- What ideas or words are emphasised, repeated or related in this passage?
- In your own words, what is the main idea of this passage? (Try to summarise these verses in 10 words or less)

**Examine** – Next, try to understand the specifics of what the passage is communicating.

- What do you notice about God? What has he done/is he doing in these verses?
- What do you learn about Jesus and his gospel from this passage?
- What does it reveal about people?
- How do you think the writer wanted his reader to respond to these words?

**Apply** - After seeking to understand God's Word in this passage, consider how he intends to use it in your heart and life today.

- Jesus is our Hilastērion; the sponge and the ballon. Why is this particularly good news for you today?
- The statement 'Jesus is Lord' is more than a personal pledge of allegiance; it's a recognition of Christ's lordship over all things. Scan the early chapter of Mark's gospel - how is this reality described in the story line?
- Where is the lordship yet to take hold in your life? It might be in a particular place, with a group of people, or in an area of behaviour. Spend some time praying 'your Kingdom come, your will be done' and ask the Lord to rule where we are resistant to surrender.
- The 6 baptised each shared their own stories of grace. What is yours?
