- How the Resurrection Works (1 Cor. 15:35-43, 1 Cor. 15:21-26, 45-46)
- Because of what Adam did, we have all died. (Romans 5:15)
- Adam sinned → Sin enters the world and corrupts the world → We
 are therefore born into a world of death with a sin nature, bound to
 commit sin and be condemned. What Adam brought into the world:
 - 1. Separation Between Us and God
 - 2. The Sin Nature for All
 - 3. A World of Death (1 Cor. 15:21)
- 1 Cor. 15:21-24
 - Adam sinned → Sin enters the world and corrupts the world →
 We are therefore born into a world of death with a sin nature,
 bound to commit sin and be condemned
 - Christ died and rose again → He rose victorious over sin and death → He freely gives that victory to all who put their faith in Him
- What Christ did:
 - 1. Jesus destroys the condemnation of sin, restoring our relationship with God. (1 Cor. 15:56-57, Romans 5:18-19)
 - 2. Jesus destroys the sin nature, giving us an ever-growing nature to become more like Him. (Phil. 1:6)
 - 3. Jesus destroys death itself, securing a future for us where life is everything it's meant to be. (1 Cor. 15:51-53)
- 1 Cor. 15:54-58, 1 Cor. 3:11-15
 - Everything founded on Jesus Christ will last forever. Everything else will be burned up.
 - Every little thing done in the name of Jesus matters.
 - o Take hold of the resurrection for yourself!
