Discussion Questions

Centered on the Gospel Part 4: Legalism and License

- 1. What most stood out to you from Sunday's message? Is there any part you hope we discuss together?
- 2. Pastor Josh described legalism as "I obey, therefore Jesus saves me." License is "Jesus saves me, therefore I don't have to obey." And the gospel is "Jesus saves me, therefore I get to obey." Which side do you think is more dangerous? Which side have you seen more of today?
- 3. When it comes to our internal reality, legalism is characterized by anxiety and fear, pride and shame, compromise, and fakeness. License is characterized by apathy, the idolatry of self, worldliness, and cowardliness about the controversial parts of following Jesus. The gospel is characterized by a secure identity in Christ, authenticity, an eagerness to follow, and graciousness. Looking at legalism and license, which side do you think you tend to lean towards and why?
- 4. Legalism views the law as a burden, and license is apathetic towards it. In the gospel we are motivated by love. How do you feel about the law of God on a daily basis?
- 5. While most churches may technically believe the gospel, it's easy to go to one side or another in church culture. A legalistic culture has high expectations, is unwelcoming, and fake. A licentious culture shies away from hard topics, is eager to grow at all costs, and is very compromising when it comes to Biblical truth. A gospel culture is one where "it's okay to not be okay, but it's not okay to stay that way." How can we in our group be part of contributing to a healthy, Christ-centered culture in the church?
