### **Discussion Questions**

### Centered on the Gospel (Part 2):

- 1. Read Luke 19:9-14. Describe the differences between the two people.
- 2. What does this passage teach us about God and ourselves?
- 3. Pastor Josh mentioned two types of people. 1) The perfectionist who can't seem to embrace the truth that they will always need God's grace. 2) The competent person who knows they need God's grace, but they don't really feel it. Do you see yourself in either of these two people? What does that look like?
- 4. Pastor Josh talked about the growing cross chart, where the longer we're a Christian the greater God's holiness becomes, the more aware we become of our own sin, and the more grateful we become for what Jesus did to fill that gap. How have you experienced this as a Christian?
- 5. In Acts 9 God converts Paul by first striking him blind. How does God use our suffering to bring us face to face with our need for Him?
