1) 00:00:02:12 — Does the “great falling away” come from deception, or could it be because people are easily offended at Christians and turn away?

Answer: Both. Scripture teaches deception drives the falling away (see 2 Thess. 2:3), but an offended, tender-hearted culture (people seeking what pleases them — “itchy ears,” 2 Tim. 4:3) makes Christians more likely to turn away when challenged by truth.

Answer: No. “Right hand” is throne-language denoting authority. The Spirit is not a human occupant of a seat — He is omnipresent and continues to indwell believers while also being present with the Father.

Answer: In context it’s the willful, informed attribution of the Spirit’s work to Satan (the Pharisees’ claim).
