

CLOTHED, ANOINTED, AND CONSECRATED: STEPPING INTO REVIVAL

Psalm Series Pt 13

CENTRAL QUESTION:

What must happen in our lives if we want to see true revival?

I. THE CALL TO REVIVAL

Key Scripture: Psalm 85:6 "Wilt thou not revive us again: that thy people may rejoice in thee?"

Key Insight: Revival assumes we were once alive. The church was thriving, then grew cold. God wants to quicken us again so we find our joy and satisfaction in Him.

Reality: Revival is not just something we wait for. It is something we step into when we prepare ourselves the way God commands.

II. CLOTHED (EXAMINE YOURSELF)

Key Scripture: Leviticus 8:10-13

What Clothing Represents:

- Aaron could not choose his own garments. Every detail was commanded by God.
- Spiritual clothing means examining our lives and putting on what God has said.
- We must look in the mirror and ask if we are ready.

Practical Application:

- Confess faults and search your heart.
- Ask God to show you where you need to grow.
- Be ready to leave old seasons behind when the brook dries up.

III. ANOINTED (RECEIVE FRESH OIL)

Key Scripture: Leviticus 8:12

What Anointing Means:

- To smear or spread with oil.
- God always anoints for a purpose, never just to sit still.
- Christ means the Anointed One. Jesus was anointed to preach, heal, and set people free.

Key Reminder:

- Oil is not permanent. We need fresh oil for each new season.
- Old oil grows stale and draws flies. Fresh oil changes everything around us.

IV. CONSECRATED (SET APART FOR GOD)

Key Scripture: Leviticus 8:33-36

What Consecration Requires:

- To be set apart and instilled with purpose.
- Seven full days of obedience and reflection.
- Not quick or easy. It demands sacrifice and focus.

Key Truth:

- Once consecrated, nothing stays the same. The tabernacle, the altar, and Aaron himself received new purpose.
- Your consecration is not just for you. It affects your family and future generations.

V. WAITING FOR THE FIRE

Key Scripture: Leviticus 9:23-24

The Final Step:

- We can be clothed, anointed, and consecrated.
- But revival only comes when God sends His fire.
- The people fell on their faces when the glory appeared.

KEY TAKEAWAY:

Revival happens when we:

- Examine and clothe ourselves in obedience
- Receive fresh anointing for our purpose
- Allow God to set us apart through consecration
- Wait for His fire to fall

FOR FURTHER REFLECTION:

- What old season might God be drying up in your life right now?
- Where do you need fresh oil instead of living on past experiences?
- How would your daily life change if you truly lived consecrated for seven days?
- Are you willing to wait for the fire, or are you trying to create revival in your own strength?
