# There's a Shaking Coming

#### **Central Question:**

What does God's shaking look like, and what is He after in our lives and in the church?

Key Text:

Acts 4:31

## I. Opening and Scripture Reading

- Reading of Acts 4:31 and the call to recognize that when God's people pray, God moves and the place is shaken.
- Theme introduced: God is bringing a shaking that leads to boldness and Spirit-filled witness.

# II. What "Shaking" Means in Scripture

- Shaking can be divine judgment or divine intervention.
- Purpose: to remove what is unstable so that what cannot be shaken remains (Hebrews 12:26–29).
- Uses both literal and figurative imagery: Sinai trembling, prophetic "heavens and earth" shaking, and prison doors opening.

## III. The Enemy's Strategy (If I were the devil)

- · Keep you from worshiping God at all.
- Make truth "relative" so no one knows up from down.
- Keep you too busy for prayer, Scripture, church, or life groups.
- Fill your hands with a phone so they're too busy to fold in prayer.
- Fracture homes: absent fathers, bitter marriages, confused children; if he fractures the home, he fractures the future.
- Divide churches with offense, comparison, petty arguments, and celebrity culture so Christians fight each other instead of resisting him.

- Desensitize sin through entertainment until what once offended now seems like "just a joke."
- Attack your identity with shame so you can't hear the Father's love.
- Greatest trick: convince you he isn't real so you never resist him.

# IV. Walkthrough of Acts 3-4

- A. Context: Acts 2 outpouring of the Holy Spirit empowers the church.
- B. The Beautiful Gate healing (Acts 3:1–10): "Silver and gold have I none, but what I have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ, rise up and walk."
- C. The miracle's purpose: opens a door for the gospel; Peter preaches Christ crucified and risen; many believe (about 5,000, Acts 4:4).
- D. Opposition: rulers, elders, and the high priestly family object specifically to the name of Jesus (Acts 4:1–7, 17–18).
- E. The mark of true disciples: "uneducated, common men," yet people recognize they "had been with Jesus" (Acts 4:13).
- F. The church's response: they pray together; God shakes the place; all are filled with the Holy Spirit and speak the word with boldness (Acts 4:23–31).

#### V. The Name of Jesus vs. Our Names

- Power and authority are not in a church brand, a pastor, a team, or a ministry.
- In the name of Jesus: sins are forgiven, bodies are healed, mountains move, and the gospel advances.

## VI. Faith Over Feelings

- The enemy uses frustration to numb us spiritually; worship is not about what we feel but about what we know and Who we know.
- We need the Holy Spirit not only in services but in our homes and daily lives.

#### VII. Illustration: The Roller That Got Shaken

A heavy roller, when lifted and shaken, dropped broken pieces that didn't belong.

 Application: when God shakes a life or a church, things not meant to remain may fall away—habits, offenses, wrong attachments, even roles or jobs that keep us from Him.

## VIII. What Might God Be Shaking Right Now?

- Busyness that edges out prayer, Scripture, church, and life groups.
- Tech overload: hands full of a phone instead of lifted in worship or folded in prayer.
- Family fractures: absent fathers, bitter marriages, confused children.
- Relative truth replacing God's truth.
- Desensitization to sin through media and culture.
- Identity confusion and shame drowning out the Father's voice.

#### IX. How We Respond

- 1. Repent of distraction, unbelief, and divided loyalties.
- 2. Re-center everything on the name of Jesus.
- 3. Seek a fresh filling of the Holy Spirit.
- 4. Pursue unity around the gospel rather than offenses and comparisons.
- 5. Pray together until God shakes our gathering and our hearts.
- 6. Speak the word of God with boldness in our homes, church, and community.

#### X. Reflection and Next Steps

- Where do I need God's shaking to remove what doesn't belong?
- What practices will I change this week to make room for prayer and Scripture?
- Who will I pray with regularly for a fresh filling and boldness?
- Where am I being silent about Jesus' name, and how will I step forward in boldness?
