

HAVE YOU CONSIDERED? (HEBREWS 3:1–6)

Central Question:

Who—or what—do you rely on for hope, direction, and freedom? Have you truly considered Jesus?

I. NOTICING THE EVIDENCE

Key Thought: Sometimes the very restrictions or frustrations in our lives are what help us see God’s blessings all around us—even if they don’t look the way we expect.

II. JESUS IS GREATER THAN MOSES

Key Scripture: Hebrews 3:1–6

- Jesus is not just another great figure—He is the builder of God’s house and our faithful High Priest.
- Moses was a faithful servant, but Christ is the Son over the entire house.
- No human leader or religious act can do what Jesus has done.

III. RESTRICTION VS. RELATIONSHIP

Reflection:

- Are we more focused on what we can’t do, or on the blessings God has given us?
- Have we unintentionally restricted our worship, prayer, or faith because of routine, disappointment, or distraction?

IV. CHRIST, OUR ONLY FOUNDATION

- Jesus alone brings us into God’s presence, offering grace, security, and true rest.
- All other blessings and leaders—including Moses—point us to Him; only Christ truly saves.

V. MOVING FORWARD

Application:

- Rather than returning to old habits or relying on ourselves, consider what it means to give your burdens, your worship, and even your future fully to Jesus.
- The same hands that created you are the hands stretched out to save you.

Key Takeaway:

Don’t settle for surface-level faith or stop at admiring spiritual leaders. Consider Jesus—His work, His invitation, and His authority in your life.

For Further Reflection:

- In what areas have you been “restricting” your worship, trust, or relationship with God?
- Where are you tempted to put your hope in something or someone other than Jesus?
- How can you “consider Christ” more deeply this week?
