Getting Started

Take some time to catch up and connect as a group. Pray before discussion. Expect God to move through your time together!

Pacing Your Group

Move quickly through "observation" leaving enough time for "reflection", "discussion", and "surrender."

Scripture Reading

Re-read the scripture passages as needed when you discuss the questions.

Observation: What does this scripture passage say? Take some time to look up and read: Romans 7:7-25

1. What big ideas does Paul work to communicate in these verses about: sin, the function of OT law, and new life in Christ.

Reflection and Discussion: What are some first thoughts flowing from the scriptures? Talk together about how the scriptures connect to everyday life

- 2. In this sermon, Scott amplifies three responses to sin:
 - Deny/Ignore (v.7-13)
 - Defeat/Giving Up (v14-23)
 - Dependence on Jesus (v24-25)

Share your thoughts about and experiences with these three responses to the battle against sin.

- 3. God's law makes people realize that they are sinners doomed to die. The law is like a sign, pointing out the threats and dangers. But the law, like a sign, is powerless to help us. Christ is the true resource that empowers us to battle sin. How does Christ empowered His people to have victory over sin?
- 4. The "law at work in the members of my body" is the sin deep within us. This is our vulnerability to sin; it refers to everything within us that is more loyal to our old way of selfish living than to God.
 - What are some common sin "loyalties" that Christians struggle to overcome?
 - What advice would you give and what testimony of encouragement or challenge could you offer to someone struggling to break a sin pattern?

Surrender: Responding to God's voice.

- 5. What is one thing God is saying to you through this study and discussion?
 - ** Take some time to pray for one another in response to what has been discussed today **
