Getting Started

Take some time to catch up and connect as a group. Pray before discussion. Expect God to move through your time together!

Pacing Your Group

Move quickly through "observation" leaving enough time for "reflection", "discussion", and "surrender."

Scripture Reading

Re-read the scripture passages as needed when you discuss the questions.

Observation: What does this scripture passage say?

Take some time to look up and read: Proverbs 21:1, Psalm 22:28, Romans 13:1

1. What do these verses tell us about God's hand in directing human history?

<u>Reflection and Discussion:</u> What are some first thoughts flowing from the scriptures? How do the scriptures connect to everyday life.

2. Take some time to reflect and discuss together the amazing, the mysterious, and the complexity of these three aspects of God's hand in history:

The Unbroken Fulfillment of Prophecy

- Approximately 25 percent of the Bible is predictive—one verse out of four!
- Approximately 2,000 different prophetic predictions; 350 about Jesus.
- Over half of Biblical predictions have been fulfilled; none have proved wrong.

The Unequaled Impact of Jesus

It is interesting and significant that a historian, without any theological bias whatever, should find that he cannot portray the progress of humanity honestly without giving a foremost place to a penniless teacher from Nazareth.
