Getting Started

Take some time to catch up and connect as a group. Pray before discussion. Expect God to move through your time together!

Pacing Your Group

Move quickly through "observation" leaving enough time for "reflection", "discussion", and "surrender."

Scripture Reading

Re-read the scripture passages as needed when you discuss the questions.

Observation: What does this scripture passage say? Take some time to look up and read: John 5:19-20a

So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of his own accord, but only what he sees the Father doing. For whatever the Father does, that the Son does likewise. For the Father loves the Son and shows him all that he himself is doing.

- 1. Describe Jesus' relationship with God. How do they interact?
- 2. How does Jesus know what to do?
- 3. Jesus this message to his followers throughout the gospels. Why do you think he repeats this over and over?

Reflection and Discussion: What are some first thoughts flowing from the scriptures? Talk together about how the scriptures connect to everyday life.

4. Where are you? Members of your group can be in many different places in their spiritual walk. Take some time to talk openly about where you are in your relationship and experience of God. Choose which descriptions below match your present relationship with God, and talk about why:
